






School Goals

The South Valley Academy goals for the 2024-2025 school year continue to center around attendance and graduation. We are focused on two main priorities. The first priority is that students are on-track for both credit accumulation and graduation. Our goal is for 90% or more of our students to be on-track for graduation and that all credit earning students have an individualized plan toward graduation. In conjunction with that, our second focus is daily and overall attendance. We are striving for our daily attendance rate to exceed 92%.

Students earning a high school diploma or GED within five years. Cohort Includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 finishing in 2022-23.




State Goals



About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

One of the many strengths of SVA is our ability to offer advanced coursework to students. Students have access to Advanced Placement (AP) classes online through Edgenuity. We also offer dual credit opportunities for students taking courses through Rogue Community College. Students submit requests for RCC courses to us at SVA and upon approval, SVA will fund those approved RCC courses. We offer the opportunity for students to complete up to two years worth of classes before students graduate with their high school diploma.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

There are many options for students interested in Career and Technical Education. Subject areas include Health Science, Hospitality, Information Technology, Business and Agriculture. SVA's Maker Space gives students of all ages opportunities for hands-on learning and industry level skills. Students can also choose from a variety of classes at RCC, and receive credit for their work experience. An entrepreneurship pathway has been created, tying classes from Edgenuity, RCC classes to our Maker Space, and eDynamic Learning an avenue for CTE and Elective Classes.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

South Valley Academy students have full access to all of the extracurricular sports and activities offered in the Rogue River School District. Transportation is provided for SVA students to participate in the offerings that take place at any of our district's school campuses. We also offer interest-based opportunities specifically for SVA students on our campus including but not limited to:

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

SVA starts the year with a back-toschool/orientation night. This event demonstrates clear expectations as well as strategies for success. Weekly communication on progress, ongoing opportunities for teacher conferencing and quarterly field trips and guest speakers provide for deep community involvement. Community partnerships provide additional opportunities for our students to be of service. Students and parents see exactly where they are in the pursuit of high school or grade level completion on a weekly basis. Students and families receive teacher support as they complete coursework and prep for essential skill assessments.
