#### Message from the Principal

Dear Families.

The first half of the 2024-25 school year is ending. As we approach this holiday season, I am grateful that Mariposa is fortunate to have a community that supports their children and provides the encouragement needed to experience the success imperative to their educational and personal development.

You entrust your children to us to ensure their safety, social, emotional, and academic growth. Your child's safety is first and foremost, our primary responsibility. Secondly, it is to ensure that your child can learn, grow, and excel academically, socially, and emotionally. Missing just two days a month of school-for any reason-can be a problem for kids in several ways. Children who are chronically absent in kindergarten and first grade are less likely to read on grade level by the third grade. For older students, being chronically absent is strongly associated with failing at school-even more than low grades or test scores. Please let us know if there is anything we can do to provide you support.

Below are some great strategies that can be established as goals as we move into 2025:

- Set attendance goals with your child and track your child's attendance on a calendar.
- Help your child get a good night's sleep.
- Prep the night before to streamline your morning.
- Try to schedule dental or medical appointments before or after school hours.
- · Schedule extended trips during school breaks.
- Don't have your child stay home unless they are truly sick.
- Talk with your child about the reasons why they do not want to go to school.
  If your child has a chronic health issue such as asthma, allergies, or seizures, talk
- with your pediatrician about developing a school action plan.
- Follow the school and state's rules for when your child is absent or late.
- Keep track of your child's attendance so you know when the days missed start to add up.

Your tax credit contributions continue to have an impact on Mariposa students and classrooms. We have been able to use the funds to for field trips, starting a First Lego Club, Broadcast Team, continue our tradition of our NEHS Club and purchase additional items for our school store to name a few. Thank you for continuing to make Mariposa a priority in your tax credit giving.

The deadline for making a tax credit contribution is April 15th. Arizona statute allows taxpayers to receive a tax credit up to \$400 for a joint tax return. Individual returns are a \$200 maximum credit. That is a tax credit - a dollar for dollar reduction of what you owe in state taxes! You can make your contribution online, download a form from the website, or pick up a form at Mariposa's front office. Thank you for your continuing support.

On behalf of the Mariposa Family, we would like to wish you a joyous holiday season! Your kindness, generosity and commitment to your children's learning are admired and appreciated! I am grateful for your ongoing support. I look forward to welcoming Mariposa's students and families back to school on Tuesday, January 7, 2025.



#### Dear families,

As we have shared in previous newsletters, we have been sending attendance letters when your child reaches 4, 8, and 13 absences. The purpose of this is to be proactive and keep you informed, so your children stay below 19 absences, which the state identifies as excessive. We understand that children get sick and family circumstances require your children to be absent from school. The portion of the letter that explains Arizona attendance law is required, but please know that our goal is always to support you and partner with you.
