


We will be meeting to discuss the upcoming 2025 marching band season! We request that every family have a representative at the meeting.




INSTRUCTIONAL FOCUS: HIGH ORDER THINKING & LEARNING

This approach not only strengthens problem-solving abilities but also promotes independent learning, creativity, and the ability to apply knowledge in real-world situations, preparing students for success beyond the classroom.

Bloom's "Revised" Taxonomy



The application of the revised Bloom's Taxonomy by teachers is crucial in fostering higher-order thinking and deeper learning among students. By emphasizing cognitive processes like analyzing, evaluating, and creating, rather than just remembering and understanding, teachers can guide students toward more meaningful learning experiences. This updated framework allows educators to design lessons that promote critical thinking, encourage creativity, and enhance problem-solving skills, better preparing students for real-world challenges and lifelong learning.
