




Benchmark Comparison: Rental




BISD rental revenues are generally above the average of our comparison districts.

Benchmark Comparison: Tuition/Fees




ECSE and Pre-K programming drives the differences you see here.

Fast Facts Student Transfers

- Interdistrict Transfers vs. Intradistrict Transfers
- Governed by BISD Board Policy FDA
- Non-residents are not permitted to attend BISD schools except for:
 - Children of Employees
 - Children of Active Duty Military
 - Children of Peace Officers
 - McKinney-Vento Act eligible students
- Application process considers:
 - Available Space
 - Instructional Staff
 - Student Disciplinary History
 - Student Attendance History
- Intradistrict Transfer Agreements
 - May be revoked if agreement terms are not met

- Board Policy GKD
- Our facilities are available to rent to organizations according to campus events and staff availability.
- Non-profit organizations can request a reduced rate.
- Liability insurance is required.
- Minimum of 4 hours.
- Classrooms, libraries, and Instructional Spaces are not available for non-school rentals.
- No rental charges for Boerne ISD support organizations such as PTO's, Booster Clubs, Boerne Education Foundation, & student activities programs, however, the district may not waive and or discount associated labor costs that may be required.
- Hourly fees are assessed for facility rental, custodial services, and security services. Based on the nature of the rental request, BISD determines the need for custodial and security services.
