Strategy of the Month

Using reading intervention strategies that work can be the difference in helping our unique readers learn to read.

Phonemic Awareness

Rhyme War - Have one person say the starting word. The next person says a word that rhymes with that word. Take turns repeating until someone can't think of a new rhyme. The last person to think of a rhyme wins!

Guess My Word - Think of a word. (ex: dog). Say the sounds in the word out loud. (ex: /d/ /o/ /g/). Let the child guess what word it is. Try using longer and longer words. For younger kids: break it into compound words or syllables (ex: /hot/ /dog/ or /um/ /brel/ /la/). For older kids: let THEM choose the mystery word and give you the sound clues to guess the word!

Sight Words to Know

Kindergarten: that, with, have, but, from, one, when, were, what, their

First: up, said, if, out, so, would, some, them, will, people,

which

Second: things, long, too, before, me, years, good, look, go, work

Third: high, every, near, west, dress, best, next, else, grand, stand

Fourth: rolled, finger, except, speed, couldn't, eleven, catch, itself, stolen,

button, bargain

Fifth: comic, ostrich, insult, grumble, gallop, hurry, distinct, contestant,

defendant, assistant, brilliant

Tips for Parents

- When students build their bank of vocabulary words, comprehension soars through the roof!
- The more words they know...
 - 1. the better they will understand what they read
 - 2. the more confidence they will have when speaking and expressing their ideas
