SGES is a small school in a small town with a global vision for our students' endeavors. Freshmen and sophomores spend time in the Pacific Northwest hiking, kayaking, and learning about art and culture. Juniors travel to the Southwest for a trip emphasizing environmental science. SGES CURRICULUM & COURSES

All courses offered by SGES are listed below; not all courses are offered every year. All non–AP classes are considered college preparatory; therefore, we do not offer any honors sections. For all AP classes, 0.5 is added to the earned GPA. SGES offers 12 AP and DE courses. Students enrolled in an AP course must sit for the corresponding AP exam. In general, scheduling conflicts prevent students from taking every AP class offered; **most students will graduate with an average of five to six AP courses, and no more than eight or nine AP courses.**

Students are advised to take no more than one AP class in grade 9, two AP classes in grade 10, three AP classes in grade 11, and four AP classes in grade 12. A student must receive special permission to exceed these recommendations. In 2024, SGES students took 96 AP exams with 73% of students scoring a 3 or above.
