
How can you help your child?


- Read to and with your child.

- Ask questions about the story after you read.
- Your child needs to read books that are easy for them to read (95% accuracy).

How can I help my child?

- ✓ Emphasize math in everyday activities and family games.
- ✓ Ask your child if there is another way to explain their thinking or to solve the problem.

- Students will be grouped so their needs can be met.
- Groups will be flexible and adjusted as needed, according to skill gaps and/or enrichment needs.

- Allows teachers to make skill based instruction.

Grading

For K-6th grade courses, students will be graded on **learning standards** on the following scale:

- 4 Independently applies skills and content with greater depth and complexity
- 3 Demonstrates grade level proficiency independently
- 2 Demonstrates grade level proficiency with support
- 1 Demonstrates below grade level proficiency with support

Students in 1st and 2nd grades will receive marks for their **overall performance** in each course of study using the following letter grade scale. Overall course grades for students in 1st and 2nd grades will be determined by the average of all overall standards scores for the grading period. The average will be converted to a letter grade of E, S, N, or U.

E = Excellent (80-100%)

S = Satisfactory (60-79%)

N = Needs Improvement (42-59%)

U = Underperforming (0-41%)





WHAT WILL THE M&O OVERRIDE FUND?

Athletics & Arts Programs

DVUSD offers competitive high school and middle school sports programs at multiple levels, and visual and performing arts such as theatre, chorus, and band for students of all talents and ages.

Free Full-Day Kindergarten

Since 2016, DVUSD has funded full-day kindergarten to our community at no out-of-pocket cost to families.

Student & Family Needs

DVUSD provides student support services such as school nurses, academic counseling, and early childhood preschool programs.

Increase Employee Pay & Maintain Class Size

Approximately 8% of employee pay comes from M&O override funding, allowing DVUSD to attract and retain teachers. This also allows DVUSD to keep the average student-to-teacher ratio at 17:1 per classroom.

Upgrade the structural integrity of many DVUSD schools, and create additional space and classroom settings that cater to the needs of today's students in the best learning environment.


