Denton Avenue students shopped for friends and family, thanks to the PTA, who set up a fully stocked Holiday Boutique!

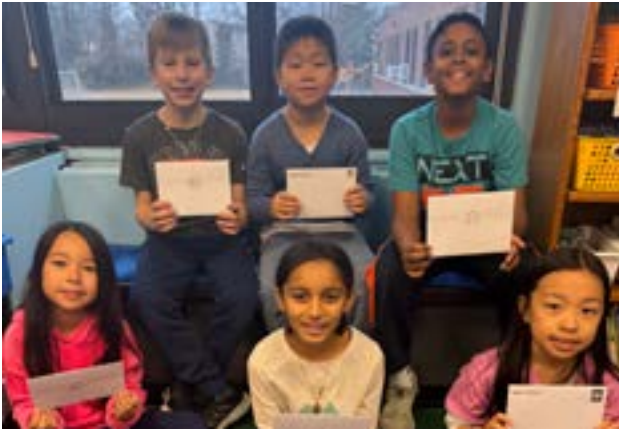

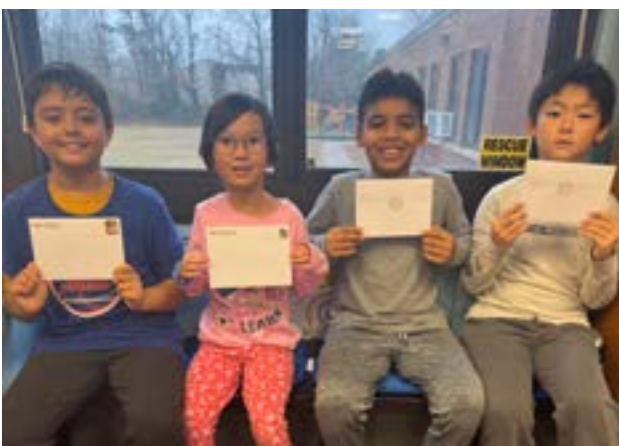
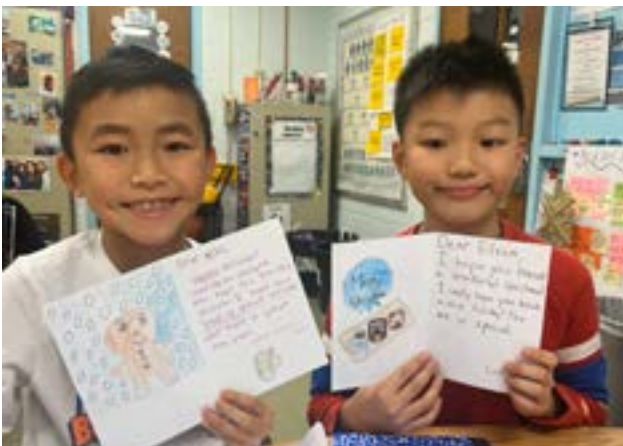
Blues musician Toby Walker stopped by Herricks Middle School to teach the Highlanders about the history behind Blues music!

Take a look at these pictures from Herricks Middle School, where students learned the important history behind blues music from musician Toby Walker!

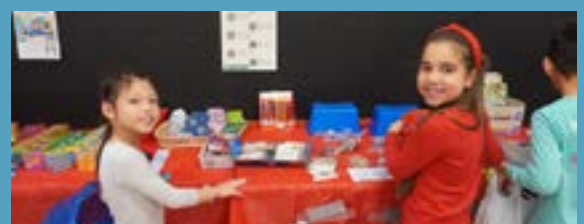
