Learning at CIS is a transformative process that leads to conceptual understanding, demonstration of competencies through application and character development as seen through the CIS care values



This year, our graduating class of 80 students is ready to positively change the world.

As a NEASC-accredited institution that prioritises transformation through conceptual understanding, demonstration of competencies through application and character development—we place our students at the centre of learning. We are the first IBDP school in Bangalore, the first 1:1 iPad school in South India, the first school in India to operate entirely on solar power and we earned the distinction of being the first Apple Distinguished School in India, by Apple Inc., for our innovative integration of technology in education.

COMBINED IBDP RESULTS

- 316 students sat the IB exam from 2020-2024
- 31.5 was the average CIS score
- 84.3% was the pass rate at CIS; higher than the world average of 84.1%
- 25 students scored above 40 on the examinations

Our IGCSE grades are awarded as follows:

Our IBDP grades can be interpreted as follows:

- A student's examination performance in individual subjects is scored on a scale of 1–7 points with 7 as the highest
- An additional 3 points are available based on a matrix of performance in Theory of Knowledge (ToK) and the Extended Essay components
- Students who meet all assessment requirements and achieve a minimum of 24 points (out of a possible 45) are awarded the IB Diploma

IB grades and courses are not weighted. CIS does not rank its students or provide percentile or decile information. We also do not calculate GPA at CIS.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Our K-12 Experiential Learning (EL) programme fosters personal and academic growth by allowing students to explore concepts from classes in real-world applications. Classroom concepts and competencies are brought to life through on-campus activities, day trips and longer excursions; students grow personally and academically as they engage with global and local issues, meet new people, discover new places and explore ideas beyond the classroom.

BOARDING PROGRAMME AT CIS

Learning continues in the boarding facilities at CIS. DISCIPLINARY POLICIES

All students are expected to truthfully answer questions regarding disciplinary violations. When applicable, it is CIS's policy to send a follow-up letter, cosigned by the principal and college counsellor which describes the incident and disciplinary response. For disciplinary actions that occur after college applications have been submitted, students and CIS will follow the same procedure.
