Taking note of New Jersey's record of excellence and achievement in public education, Gov. Chris Christie proclaimed January 2017 as <u>School Board Recognition Month</u>. Ms. Lobianco was also chosen for the Honor Award for 2017 on behalf of the ${\tt SHAPE}$ America Eastern District.

Ms. LoBianco is currently serving on the SHAPE America board of directors and has been nominated for President; the election results will be announced on March 18, 2017.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of December 19, 2016 and January 4, 2017 approved as presented.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE

Goal 1

Adoption and Initial Implementation of Strategic Plan:

- We have developed and are following a plan to create Year One and 3-Year implementation schedules for the Action Plans.
- \bullet We are considering feedback from staff and community members as we identify initiatives for the first year, and those for years 2-3.
- We will present a preliminary plan for Year One to the Board, staff and community in February for review and feedback.

Goal 2

Responsible Financial Management:

- We are continuing our zero-based budgeting initiative, and feedback from administrators has been very positive. They have expressed appreciating the opportunity to think creatively about what they need and what initiatives they would like to prioritize next year, rather than just being given a set amount to decide how to spend in specific areas.
- We are carefully working to identify potential cost savings to offset the costs of any new or expanded initiatives.
- Ross Haber has developed 6 different possible scenarios for optimizing our building utilization, which will be discussed by FFT.

Goal 3

Execution Plan that Assures Effective Implementation of BoE Policies and Monitoring:

- Access and Equity
 - o District Data Team
 - Professional Development was given to the District Administrative Team
 (DAT) on how to begin to structure school data teams
 - District Data team will continue to meet monthly in order to develop structures and processes for school leadership to develop their own School Data Teams.
 - o Academic Placement Regulations Committee met in December and January.
 - A committee of teachers and administrators reviewed our current academic placement regulations, compared how different districts structure their GPA Weights, and discussed different configurations for levels and academic support options that will foster students' individual academic needs.
 - Their initial recommendations were shared with the Strategic Leadership team today and we are in the process of determining next steps.
 - o The lunchtime tutoring program created by the Columbia High School administration team in cooperation with the National Honor Society members is underway during all three lunch periods. Students are individually paired with tutors in subject areas for help either through their own request or teacher referral. The support from the Achieve tutoring coordinator has made this possible.
 - o Student Council leaders have worked with Ms. Aaron to present information from student surveys about the current bell schedule and any possible changes in the school years ahead.
- Focus schools just completed Cycle 1 reviews. We just finished our second benchmarks and are analyzing the data to inform our intervention action plans.

Goal 4

Develop a Plan to Improve the Climate and Culture in Our School Community:

- Cultural Competency
 - o Working with Dr. Joshi on a series of elementary assemblies called "Who Belongs?"
 - o Professional Learning Communities in every building are continuing their work on different topics related to cultural competency.
 - o This month, board members participated in a session with Dr. Joshi.

- Community Engagement events
 - o I am continuing to meet with staff from different buildings at Tuesday meetings to discuss implementation of the Access & Equity policy and any concerns or ideas which the staff wishes to address. So far, I have met with staff from Columbia High School, Maplewood Middle School, South Orange Middle School and South Mountain School.
 - o A town Hall meeting was held for elementary school families last week, which was attended by approximately 100 parents and guardians.
 - o Dr. Ramos and Mrs. Grierson visited South Mountain Annex during lunchtime today to observe, as promised, in response to concerns raised by parents at the town hall about the lunch aide to student ratio at the Annex.
 - o The annual Kindergarten Q&A event was attended by 200 incoming kindergarten parents and guardians. Many thanks to the administrators and teachers who gave up their Saturday morning to help welcome new families to our district and our schools. This is just the first of many opportunities designed to help families transition into kindergarten.
 - o Ninth grade preview night was held, as an early introduction to Columbia for current $8^{\rm th}$ grade families.
 - o The district will host a community screening of the groundbreaking documentary film $13^{\rm th}$ at South Orange Middle School.
 - 13th was screened at Columbia High School last fall as an optional evening event, and prompted a great deal of thoughtful discussion.
 - Several middle school teachers raised the idea of showing the film to their students as well, as part of a WIN period class on "marginalized voices."
 - Recognizing both the importance of the film and the graphic and disturbing nature of some of the material, administrators decided to share the film in an evening program for families, instead of during class time. We have also invited Khalil Gibran Muhammad, who is a SOMSD parent and one of the interviewees, to facilitate a discussion immediately following the film.
 - We decided on this approach for a number of reasons, including:
 - Having a facilitated discussion with Khalil Muhammad will provide context and make it an even deeper and more meaningful experience.
 - It provides students with an opportunity to view and discuss this film in an age appropriate way.
 - It creates a larger community dialogue, engages families in discussing the film together, and provides parents and guardians with tools to help their children process the strong images they will see.
- Student Engagement Events
 - o Three lunch time conversations on school climate and culture was held at Columbia High School
 - o Dr. Ramos met with Parnassian students for a lunch time discussion group
- In January, a number of Professional Development initiatives focused on Language Arts:
 - o Grade 8 English Language Arts teachers met to continue to work on tiered assignments.
 - o Lab sites are set up in the middle schools to model good Language Arts instruction, with opportunities for debriefing
 - o Elementary School teachers were immersed in Teachers' College professional development
- Elementary Principals did a walk through at Seth Boyden to observe best practice and determine next steps.

• Our new Interim Director of Special Services, David Lieberman is in process of meeting with every principal as part of identifying their perspective on special education in their building, including needs, strengths and areas of concern. Mr. Lieberman is also scheduled to meet with the Special Education Advisory Committee (SEPAC) at their regular meeting Wednesday night.
