

Excerpt from the article:

A common criticism of charter schools is that they don't attract or adequately serve students with learning disabilities who require special education teachers, aides, technology, or other costly accommodations. "While some charter schools have leveraged their autonomy to develop noteworthy programs for students with disabilities, these examples are exceptions rather than the rule," states a <u>July report</u> by the Center for Learner Equity, a Manhattan-based special ed advocacy group. "For students of color, multilingual learners, or those living in poverty who also have a disability, charter schools' struggles to educate students with disabilities threaten to compound the disadvantages that historically marginalized students already face."

On Tuesday, the nonprofit New Jersey Children's Foundation announced that it had received a \$1 million grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to support special education among Newark charter schools with just those kinds of student populations.


"Newark charter schools will be able to implement an evidence-based program design that we believe will lead to increased achievement for our students with disabilities thanks to this Gates Foundation grant," said Barbara Martinez. CEO of the Newark-based Children's Foundation. Under the grant program, recipient schools will receive \$100,000 each to implement strategies developed under a nationwide initiative known as the <u>IGNITE Network</u>, which aims to improve outcomes among special education students from communities of color or low incomes.

MPTCS hosted 40 participants from the 7 participating schools that were awarded a grant.





During the walkthrough, the team observed preschool classrooms. Teaching assistants effectively stepped in to ensure continuity in the absence of the teacher, maintaining a smooth flow of instruction. Teachers and TAs were observed working collaboratively, creating a supportive and cohesive classroom environment. The use of "turn and talk" strategies was used to foster engagement and peer interaction. There was consistent and effective use of curricular materials, aligning with developmental and instructional goals for preschool students.

















Scholastic Book Fair in our Schools: Growing a Love for Reading 📚
