BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Dr. Gaudelli

Melissa Butler, Teacher of Language Arts at South Orange Middle School, was awarded the 2014 National Bammy Award as The Middle School Teacher of the Year, at the 2014 Annual Bammy Awards celebration. "The Bammy Awards is a NATIONAL celebration of the value of education, educators and life-long learning, presented by the Academy of Education Arts and Sciences International, which includes an eclectic cadre of leading educators, education leaders, education professors, journalists, editors, researchers, commentators, advocates, activists, visionaries and pioneers.

Columbia High School Track and Field Head Coach, Lisa Morgan, will be inducted into the Newark Athletic Hall of Fame at the 26th Annual Induction Dinner later this month. Ms. Morgan is a CHS alumnus and has been the coach for both the boys' and girls' track and field teams since 2008. "Ms. Morgan received the Essex County Coach of the Year honors eight times and is the only coach in Essex County history to garner the Coach of the Year honors for both boys' and girls' teams in the same year. SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE

Mr. Memoli read a statement regarding the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) complaint.

- Working with college board reps to identify additional students exhibiting aptitude for AP courses.
- Mac Scholars attended the annual Minority Student Achievement Network Conference.
- Middle school schedule changes address:
 - o Additional support for struggling students
 - o Common planning time for teachers
 - o Enhanced related arts elective program
- In Preparation for PARCC implementation, we have acquired one chromebook for every two students in testing grades.
- The District celebrated a "week of respect" last week with activities across the district.
- Focus schools are hosting regional teams for walk-throughs to measure progress.

Goal 2 Professional Staff:

- District administration participated in a Full-Day workshop on multicultural education. The focus was striving for justice and creating the environment for culturally relevant teaching.
- First learning walk of year took place (25 participants) and 26 teachers are signed up for the next learning walk training.
- Teachscape training took place for all administrators to prepare for observations.
- High school working to involve all staff in middle states process.
- Planning taking place for November 4th professional development day.
- All departments and schools are working on student growth objectives.

Goal 3 Engagement and Outreach:

- K-2 curriculum night took place at Marshall School on October 15. Approximately 125 parents attended 3 workshops. Parents received an overview of what their children will learn, and tools for supporting their children at home.
- \bullet 3-5 overview of curriculum will take place on October $27^{\rm th}$ at Jefferson School.

- Back to school nights happened at all 9 schools, providing families with an early opportunity to meet their children's teachers.
- Grade specific parent nights have been held for 10th-12th grades at CHS.
- PARCC frequently asked questions is being developed to share information on new testing protocols.
- 9th grade preview night for 8th grade families is scheduled for November 19.
- Work is underway to streamline the district website.

DISCUSSION

IB UPDATE

Ms. Grierson gave an update on implementation to date. Ms. Grierson met with the middle school teachers and received feedback from many staff that the program is exciting but implementation has had issues. SOMS applied for authorization in October and MMS will apply in the spring.

Mr. Adams, MMS Principal, shared his thoughts and is excited that IB is happening and that students are engaged at such high levels of academics.

Eve Kingsbury, IB Coordinator at SOMS, presented a powerpoint presentation on IB [on file in Board Secretary's Office]. She described the professional development status regarding IB.

Joe Uglialoro, SOMS Principal, spoke about where we are going next and how IB provides framework for best practices and assessments. Mr. Uglialoro appreciates feedback from staff about what is working and what isn't working in terms of IB.

Mrs. Grierson reviewed the District expenses associated with IB MYP programme.

Board discussion followed including:

- Appreciates hearing both the good and bad of IB.
- Appreciates the hard work of everyone involved. Realize that this is difficult but education is becoming global.
- Mrs. Grierson thanked content supervisors as their help has really led the charge.
- It's been three years but still hearing about defects. Professional development is not taking place.
- IB may not lend itself as well to certain content areas.
- IB is not a good model for high school

• Not all costs are captured. Need to consider what else the funds could be used for.

Harassment, Intimidation, Bullying and Violence and Vandalism - Mr. Roth

Mr. Roth presented a Powerpoint presentation which included the total count of incidences and comparison to prior year reporting [presentation on file in Board Secretary's office].

Discussion followed the presentation including:

- Concern that numbers are growing over time and questions what we can do to bring the numbers down. Addressing through additional social workers, character-building etc.
- Are buildings interpreting criteria differently? Consistency is needed. The state has changed data and definitions.
- To reduce theft, encourage students to bring locks or ask that valuables are not brought into the locker room.
- How do bullying incidences get reported? All staff are responsible for reporting bullying to principals and informing parents.

 Principals must immediately involve anti-bullying specialist to be investigated. Students should be able to speak with anyone in the building and be confident that the process will be triggered.

Board Goals

There have been no changes to board goals since discussion at last meeting. New information provided on cultural competency work that board will do after new members take seats.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Equity and Excellence - Dr. Gaudelli

The committee received an update on common core and PARCC readiness, and an IB update. District goals were discussed including the curriculum revision chart to be finalized by next meeting. Looked at STEM courses and informing people of those opportunities. Also discussed expansion of 1:1 computing and recommend delaying by a year. Need to revisit work done by DMC and received a Gifted and Talented update to be considered at November meeting.

Policy and Monitoring - Mrs. Daugherty

Discussed evaluations and how student outcomes are affecting summative ratings. Reviewed the Special education update for next month including updates from the consolidated monitoring report and procedures and training with the Special Education Department.

Communications and Outreach - Ms. Pai

Discussed communication regarding student progress, teachers using Gradebook and parent portal for Powerschool. Would like to see standardized communications. Currently different teachers use different methods of outreach to parents. Talked about the district website, and about communication around middle school schedule changes.

Finance, Facilities and Technology - Mrs. Lawson-Muhammad

Requested a more granular breakdown of cost of IB training. Discussed the technology report, modifying the timeline for CHS renewal in order to align discussions with the middle states process, previewed the comprehensive maintenance plan and discussed emergency management.
