- Pet-sitting or dog walking
- babysitting
- Moving a person's belongings into a new house or storage area
- Favors for family and or friends
- No work for any organization whose philosophy is contrary to the teachings of the Catholic Church
- No work for any for-profit organization or company in the course of its business. With the exception of a company's charitable service activity. For example: working in a lawyers office organizing a file for a client is not acceptable. Volunteering at the law office's blood drive is acceptable.
- Nothing can be received in return for the service. This includes money or gifts.
- No service done for the benefit of an immediate family member is acceptable without the prior approval of the Director of Campus Ministry.
- No parent may verify, (sign for), hours without the approval of the Director of Campus Ministry.
- (Remember there is a PP on the student portal that walks you step-by-step through the Mobile Serve app. Your Theology teacher also walked you through the process!)
