SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Osborne

Goal 1

- There were more than 90 different classes and programs offered this summer. A more detailed report will be available in September.
- New Jersey Monthly magazine announced that Columbia High School has moved up to #47 and is ranked in the top 15% of public high schools in New Jersey.
- The State Department of Education reviewed the district's QSAC report and determined that the district has met the requirements to be designated a high performance school district. Commissioner Cerf will recommend that the district be recognized as a high performance district.
- Reading Intervention teachers are receiving training for a new initiative to help all students to perform on grade level by third grade.
- The Middle School Transformation initiative has partnered with the Parenting Center, YouthNet Achieve, HSA for after school programming to support the International Baccalaureate (IB) Program.
- The middle school Transformation also calls for online opportunities, which will be offered this fall.
- The summer step-up program for the new 6th grade math was very successful.

Goal 2

- The district is 100% staffed for the new school year with the exception of one kindergarten teacher for a new class recently added and a replacement for Dr. Allen, Principal of Marshall School, as a result of her recent resignation. The interview process is in progress.
- New staff orientation will be held this week and staff development for all staff will take place next week. Fifty different professional development programs will be offered to the staff next week including workshops on performance evaluations for those staff who use the Danielson Framework.
- The Teach NJ Act was signed into law on August 6, 2012. Changes in the tenure process were explained to clarify how the new law will affect district staff.

Goal 3

- New student emergency information is in place to streamline the process. Parents will receive a printout of their contact information from Power School to check for accuracy and can make any necessary changes.
- Columbia High School schedules are being mailed this week.

Goal 4

- Food Service Department has been hard at work developing menus to meet new federal guidelines.
- The flexible spending account for employees will begin September 1.
- Auditors are working with the district and will present their findings in November.

We are ten months and three days away from the end of the current contract with SOMEA and hopeful that the new contract will be settled in a timely manner.
