- 1. Columbia High School students won five of the nine major film awards and one Special Mention at the Montclair International Film Festival. The students received their awards at a ceremony on January 12. All of the students' classes are taught by Columbia High School film and animation teacher Mr. Boris Gavrilovic. - 2. Columbia High School senior Melanie Barnett was published in the "Voices" section of the January 2, 2012 edition of the New York Times Upfront Magazine. She wrote a column about her experience as an adopted Chinese American. A number of district Language Arts teachers in both middle and high school are using Melanie's story as part of their reading assignments in their classes.
- 3. Columbia High School sophomore Cameron MacIntosh, a percussionist taught by Columbia Band Director Peter Bauer, was selected to participate in the 2012 Grammy Camp Jazz Band. The Grammy Camp, sponsored by the Grammy Awards, invites 30 of the best high school jazz musicians from across the country to Los Angeles to play and record an album and also attend the February Grammy week festivities, all expenses paid. The student musicians have the opportunity to perform with Grammy winners and nominees at jazz venues and Grammy events, including the official post-Grammy celebration.
- 4. Columbia High School senior Elena Riecke had her junior research paper accepted by and published in *The Concord Review*, a quarterly journal that publishes outstanding historical essays from high school students. Elena wrote about the Fred Harvey Company and the "Harvey Girls." In a letter written to Elena by *The Concord Review* founder Will Fitzhugh, he said that her paper would be used by history teachers internationally to provide their students with an exemplary example of good historical writing.
- 5. District Supervisor of English Language Arts 6-12 Gary Pankiewicz was part of a group of teachers who received the "Writing Program Excellence Award" from The National Council Teachers of English's Conference on College Composition and Communication. Academic Placement Recommendations - Dr. Osborne

The topic was introduced by Dr. Osborne and presented by Dr. Lovie Lilly, principal of Columbia High School, Chris Preston, Supervisor of Social Studies 6-12; Al Levin, Supervisor of Science 6-12; and Gary Pankiewicz, Supervisor of English Language Arts 6-12.

Dr. Gaudelli arrived at 8:11 p.m. 8 voting members present

Highlights of the presentation include:

- Proposal seeks to correct placement based on data and to support struggling students and help increase access for higher level
- Coursework is very rigorous and the proposal provides extra support for students to meet the rigor.
- All English Language Arts (ELA) electives will be mixed level
- Maintain ELA AP courses in grades 11 and 12.
- Maintain current course requirements for all students including research papers in grade 11 Social Studies.
- Supplemental readings are staples in Social Studies classes, and will continue to be used as means for assessing students.
- Collapse levels and create one Social Studies level course in each grade with continued AP courses available.
- The proposal introduces a course for English Language Learner students. Coupled with ELA support, the course would allow for support in Social Studies while continuing to address common core standards for literacy.

- In Science, the proposal centers on 9th grade biology offering 2 levels biology and honors biology and maintains the existing ELL biology course.
- There are no additional proposals for grades 10 and 11.

school(s) in which they have taught, and who consistently demonstrate the ability to inspire a love of learning in students of all backgrounds and abilities. Each of the 9 district schools chooses one teacher who will receive the Innovation and Excellence Award from their school and then the school forwards that award recipient's name to the District Selection Committee who will award one of them with the District Innovation and Excellence in Teaching award.

The draft included eligibility criteria, selection timeline and instructions for the selection of award winners.

Section 1. The Board of Education hereby approves the following proposal.

PROPOSAL

The South Orange-Maplewood Board of Education, in the County of Essex, is authorized: (1) to undertake the Improvement Projects; (2) to expend for all of the foregoing an amount not exceeding \$15,622,671; and (3) to issue bonds of the South Orange-Maplewood Board of Education, in the County of Essex, for said purposes in the aggregate principal amount of up to and including \$13,858,000.

Section 2. In order to provide for the forgoing proposal, the Board of Education hereby authorizes the issuance of bonds in an amount not exceeding \$13,858,000. It is reasonably believed that the local share of the \$15,622,671 of costs to be borne by the Board of Education for the Improvement Projects will be from \$13,858,000 to be funded through the issuance of the school bonds authorized herein and from other available funds, including remaining proceeds of prior school bond issues as set forth in Section 3 hereof.

Section 3. In order to provide for the foregoing proposal, the Board of Education hereby appropriates the sum of \$1,765,143 from the remaining proceeds of the Board of Education's School Bonds, Series 2005 (\$49,069) and from the remaining proceeds of the Board of Education's School Bonds, Series 2008 (\$1,667,005). The capital improvements for which such funds were raised are hereby determined to have been completed or to have been abandoned.

Section 4. Any bond issued pursuant to this resolution shall be a general obligation of the school district. The full faith and credit of the school district are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the bonds. SECTION 1. Authority for Resolution. This resolution is also adopted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:24-12, in conjunction with the Bond Resolution, for the purpose of authorizing the issuance and sale of School Bonds of the Board of Education in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$13,858,000. In the event of any inconsistency between this Resolution and the Bond Resolution, the Bond Resolution shall be deemed to have been amended to the extent of such inconsistency and this Resolution shall be deemed to control.

SECTION 2. Combination of Bonds; Authority of Sale. In accordance with and to provide for the costs of the various Improvement Projects and to pay the costs of issuing such School Bonds, there are to be issued School Bonds of the Board of Education in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$13,858,000. All of said Bonds shall constitute a single issue and shall be designated "School Bonds, Series 2012".

SECTION 3. Details of Bonds. The Bonds will be issued in fully registered form. One certificate shall be issued for the aggregate principal amount of Bonds maturing in each year. Both principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, which will act as Securities Depository. The certificates will be on deposit with The Depository Trust Company. The Depository Trust Company will be responsible for maintaining a book entry system for recording the interests of its participants or the transfers of the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records recording the beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds on behalf of individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$5,000 or any multiple thereof (provided that such minimum amount of the Bonds in excess of the largest principal amount thereof equaling a multiple of \$5,000 will be in the denomination of \$1,000 or any integral multiple thereof) through book entries made on the books and records of The Depository Trust Company and its participants. The Bonds will bear interest payable semiannually on the Interest Payment Dates set forth below until maturity at a rate per annum, expressed in a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1% as proposed by the successful bidder in accordance with the Notice of Sale authorized herein. The principal of and the interest on the Bonds will be paid to the Securities Depository by the Board of Education on the respective maturity dates and due dates and will be credited on the respective maturity dates and due dates to the participants of The Depository Trust Company as listed on the records of The Depository Trust Company as of the fifteenth day next preceding the respective Interest Payment Date or such earlier dates as may be required by The Depository Trust Company (the "Record Dates" for the Bonds).

Under such circumstances the Board of Education shall designate a successor securities depository or deliver certificates to the beneficial owners of the Bonds, as the case may be.

SECTION 8. Ownership of Bonds. The Board of Education and any Paying Agent may treat and consider DTC as the holder and absolute owner of any Bond, whether such Bond shall be overdue or not, for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal of or interest thereon and for all other purposes whatsoever.
