A Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of South Orange-Maplewood was held in the District Meeting Room at the Administration Building, 525 Academy Street, Maplewood, New Jersey, on August 22, 2011.

Board President Elizabeth Daugherty called the meeting to order at 7:59 p.m.

BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Mrs. Daugherty

- 1. Two Columbia High School students won awards in the William Patterson Poetry Contest for world languages. Rising junior Jordan Avello won Second Place in the Italian Beginner category and 2011 graduate Orgason Sagaille won Honorable Mention in the ELL Advanced category. More than 700 students entered the competition from across the state.
- 2. A number of awards were won by students in Mr. Boris Gavrilovic's film and animation classes at Columbia High School.
 - The "Best Production Award" was awarded to Zoe Pulley, Annie Epstein, and Ethan Oberman for their short 16mm film entry "A Sedated Seat," at the 7th annual Not Quite Legal Film Festival, the 21 and under category of the Trenton Film Festival. The CHS film competed against 23 other entries created by young filmmakers throughout New Jersey.
 - The "Official Selection" of the Westport Youth Film Festival went to Lydia Watson-Lewis and Sam Skoller for their experimental film "Lucid Dreams."
 - "Jury Awards" were won by three films entered in the New Jersey Young Film and Videomakers Festival:

 "A Sedated Seat," a short film by Zoe Pulley, Annie Epstein, and Ethan Oberman
 "Lucid Dreams," a short film by Sam Skoller and Lydia Watson-Lewis
 "Jurassic Park 4" an animated film by William Tutino and Andrew Adams

- The "Audience Award" was presented to Danielle Lee and Joseph Osie, at the Kent Place Film Festival, for their animated film "Orange and Cat."
- 3. Ms. Hannah Edelman, CHS art and special education teacher, was invited to participate in the N.J. Council for the Humanities (NJCH) multi-disciplinary seminar - "Poverty, Affluence and the American Dream." The week-long, summer program offered Ms. Edelman the opportunity to examine works related to the poverty, wealth and class of the last 150 years.
- 4. Five members of the CHS Girls Track Team were named "All-Americans" follow their extraordinary accomplishments at the New Balance Nationals competition in North Carolina. Olivia Baker, Ambur Ballew, Maya Hinton, Whitney Jackson, and Kiana Winston placed fourth in the Championship 800m Sprint Medley Relay in a time of 1:45.60 and the Championship 1600m Sprint Medley Relay in a time of 4:02.36.

The CHS Girls Track Team is under the direction of Head Coach Lisa Morgan. Coach Morgan's outstanding leadership skills helped her receive a national coaching appointment naming her the Distance Coach for Team USA for the 2011 IAAF World Youth Track & Field Championships, this summer, in Lille, France.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Osborne

Goal 1

- Summer School consisted of twenty-three online courses and thirty-four onsite classes for students in grades 6-12 as well as three elementary programs. The district provided support to more than 1,000 students this summer.
- Special Education teachers participated in training on IPad technology in preparation for teacher-initiated programs being implemented in the fall.
- HSPA results will be covered this evening; NJASK results are not yet available.

Goal 2

- We have only a few vacancies on staff as we move towards opening school.
- Received over 200 responses to the survey on the evaluation system and are using the feedback to enhance the system.

Goal 3

- New microphones and other updated audio visual equipment was installed in the DMR for live streaming capabilities in the future.
- Solicited community feedback on Board Goals.

Goal 4

- Charged fees for onsite Columbia High School credit recovery courses. Summer School tuition totaled approximately \$7,000. Data will be available at a later time.
- Written report on 2002 Refunding Bonds for a savings of \$346,000 in capital was distributed to the Board members [on file in Board Secretary's office].

The staff will be working with students over this year to see if the readiness for middle school pilot program helped with the transition, and to determine whether or not to continue it.

HEARING ON SUPERINTENDENT'S CONTRACT AMENDMENT - Mrs. Daugherty

Mrs. Daugherty reported that goals and milestones are what a superintendent is measured against, and that the district had a great year under the direction of Superintendent Osborne. The Board proposed a 2% salary increase, the highest allowed by the county superintendent, reflecting that he met or exceeded all expectations.

2791AE. WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 444, signed into law on May 26, 2011, disqualifies members of boards of education or members of charter school boards of trustees from serving in office if they have been convicted of certain crimes; and

WHEREAS, the statute also requires members to undergo criminal history background checks and to pay the cost of such investigations; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 444 permits local boards of education to reimburse individual members for the cost of criminal history background investigations; and

WHEREAS, State law (N.J.S.A. 18A:12-4) prohibits the compensation of local board of education members; and

WHEREAS, members of the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education devote significant time and substantial effort to the governance of the district's public schools; and

WHEREAS, the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education believes that individual school board members, who are uncompensated, should be reimbursed for the cost the criminal history background investigations, which are necessary to continue serving in office. So, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that pending formal adoption of new policy, the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education authorizes reimbursement of individual members for the cost of the criminal history background investigations required by Assembly Bill 444; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education through its policy adoption process will amend Policy 0142 to include the requirements of Assembly Bill 444.

2791AF. Approves an agreement with Action Based Learning of Murphy, Texas, to provide a staff development workshop for classroom teachers of grades 1-5 and physical education teachers of grades K-12 at a rate of \$3,950.
