BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Mrs. Daugherty

- 1. Columbia High School junior Jacob McNamara was selected to attend the twenty-ninth annual summer Research Science Institute (RSI), which is run by the Center for Excellence in Education in collaboration with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Held at MIT for six weeks, the program is designed for young scholars (50 U.S. and 30 international) planning careers in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. It is cost-free to students and combines on-campus course work in scientific theory with off-campus work in science and technology research. Jake gives credit for his success to his Columbia math teachers Mr. Mani Arguelles, Dr. Scott Stornetta, Mr. Michael Morrill, his Science/Physics Teacher and Supervisor of Mathematics Dr. Candice Beattys.
- 2. Columbia High School senior Michelle Strothers has been recognized as co-winner of the 2012 Princeton Prize in Race Relations for the Northern NJ Area. The award was established by Princeton University in order "to promote harmony, respect, and understanding among people of different races by identifying and recognizing high school age students whose efforts have had a significant, positive effect on race relations in their schools or communities."

Michelle has been involved in a variety of activities to support a positive atmosphere at Columbia. Most recently, she helped to start Columbia's new club, *Diversity Rocks*, which aims to educate, celebrate, and discuss various types of diversity.

A reception for the prize winners was held on April 19, where Michelle received a prize of \$500.00. She will also be invited to attend the 5th Princeton Prize Symposium on Race on April 27 and 28, along with all prize winners.

- 3. Five Columbia High School students achieved perfect scores (800) on the SAT's in one or more of the three categories of the test, Reading, Math and Writing. The students include Sophia Eller and Jacob McNamara, who achieved perfect scores in all three categories, and Andrew Dodd and Neil Miller, who received an 800 in Reading, and Benjamin Fischer, who achieved an 800 in Math.
- 4. Two district students were accepted into highly prestigious and competitive New Jersey All-State Orchestras. In order to audition, students must have already been accepted into regional orchestras.

Columbia High School sophomore Conor O'Hale was one of only ten bassists selected for the NJ All-State Orchestra, placing second in the competitive audition. His Columbia High School orchestra teacher is Mr. Todd Van Beveran. The Orchestra will perform in November at the New Jersey Teachers' Convention in Atlantic City and at NJPAC.

South Orange Middle School eighth grader Christina Johnson, a violist was accepted into the All-State Intermediate String Orchestra, placing third in the competition. A concert will be held in May. Her South Orange Middle School orchestra teacher is Mr. William Cook.

- 5. Montclair State University Theatre Night Awards nominated four members of Columbia High School's theater company, Parnassian Society, for awards for the recently performed The Canterbury Tales. They include:
 Outstanding Performance in a Supporting Role: Anni Epstein, senior Outstanding Performance in a Leading Role: Jackson Scalera, senior Outstanding Achievement in Costume Design: Dr. Janet Bustrin Outstanding Set Design: Mr. Stephen Stubelt.
- 6. CHS senior Ash Lumpkin was accepted by Cooper Union, a very prestigious art, engineering and architecture school in New York City that provides full tuition to all who attend. Only six percent of those who apply are accepted. Mr. Kevin Testa is Ash's art teacher at Columbia.
- 7. Maplewood Middle School eighth grader Michael Vick was one of five students to win *Scholastic Scope Magazine's* nationwide January writing contest. Michael is a student in Mr. Charles Schneekloth's English Language Arts class.
- 8. The art work of three Seth Boyden Demonstration School students was selected for exhibit at the Essex County Hall of Records during the Month of March. Amelia Heinze, second grader, and Ella Opdenberg and Bernadette Clawson, fifth graders were among 101 students throughout Essex County to be honored in this manner. This exhibit was sponsored by Essex County Executive Joseph DeVincenzo, Jr. in partnership with the Art Educators of New Jersey. Seth Boyden art teacher Ms. Judy Elman selected the students' work for submission.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mrs. Daugherty declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of March 5, 2012, March 12, 2012, Public Session of April 3, 2012 and Executive Session of April 16, 2012 approved as presented.

DISCUSSION

Facilities Assessment Overview

Mrs. Schneider introduced Joe Donnelly and Tom Andrasz of EI Associates, the firm that was hired by the district to conduct a comprehensive facilities conditions assessment of all district facilities in the fall of 2011. Through a power point presentation, the process and results of their assessment were explained.

The presentation was followed by comments among Board members.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Osborne

Goal 1

- The district is moving ahead with training for the International Baccalaureate Program. Teachers have visited the Cherry Hill school district, and have plans to visit a Philadelphia district where the program has been implemented.
- A special education reading intervention program is to be piloted for grades K-5 at Clinton School.
- Foreign Language for Elementary Schools (FLES) Program integrates teaching by secondary students to elementary students. Parents were invited to the final class where students presented in Italian, Spanish, French and Latin.

- The culminating appropriation of the PEP Grant funds was for the installation of an updated and expanded Project Adventure course for the high school PE department. The event was marked with an Opening Ceremony that included participation on the course by students, administrators and a Board member.
- The annual Shakespeare Festival was held at the high school.
- CHS in Action night was held last week. More than fifty clubs and teams were represented.
- The NJ Department of Education designated three focus schools in the district - Clinton Elementary, Maplewood Middle and South Orange Middle. Additional information on this will be forthcoming at a later date

Goal 2

- Monitoring Report for evaluations was included in the packet to Board members. Contracting with TeachScape to do classroom observations aligned with Danielson's Framework which will address anticipated DOE requirements and district goals around evaluations.
- Professional development Elementary math teachers will participate in the second round of Singapore Math workshops. Implementation is to begin in grades K-2 in September 2012 and grades 3-5 in September 2013. Consultant Judy Haynes has completed professional development on ELA for staff.
- The district is working to improve the quality of substitute teachers.

Goal 3

- Invited parents to hear about changes for Special Education.
- Summaries of structural changes have been distributed to parents.
- Administration met with YMCA leaders so that together we may better meet the needs of the community.
- A meeting regarding the lunch program was held with administrators and PTA representatives, and some of the suggestions that resulted from that meeting are being implemented in the program.

Goal 4

- After a cooperative effort, the school district budget for 2012-13 was approved. The commitment and time of all public officials is greatly appreciated.
- The district's insurance agent, NJSBAIG, is soliciting quotes for continued quality coverage going forward. The district was awarded the 2011 NJ Safety Award.
- Hearings have begun with parents of 10th graders who have not yet re-registered.
- Bidding for summer construction projects has begun. The CHS auditorium project is moving ahead; acoustical testing is being done at this time.
- Flexible spending program will begin in September; meetings will be held in May to inform employees about it.
- May 25th will be a give-back snow day for most district schools because the three built in days were not needed this year.
 Columbia High School, Marshall Elementary and South Mountain Annex are required to be open on May 25th to satisfy State law of

180 school days due to a power outages earlier in the year that closed those three schools.

The district mourns the sudden loss of CHS PE teacher Mark McCombs.

The district is committed to implementing the best practices to improve the Special Education program. The bid called for a consultant with expertise and deep analytical capacity to implement initiatives in special education. District Management Council submitted a big that was responsive to the specifications.
