SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Osborne

Goal 1

- Middle school transformation continues to be implemented and both middle schools are now recognized as Middle Year Program candidates. Middle School staff visited another school district that has implemented MYP, and the first team received level one MYP training. Both middle schools used the April staff meeting to introduce MYP, and a program trainer will come to the district later in the year.
- The annual Shakespeare festival took place, and a Shakespearean Literature course was introduced this year.
- The agreement with Effective School Solutions will be voted upon tonight; the annual survey of secondary school outcomes of special needs students is encouraging.
- A Technology Plan committee is being formed.
- This summer will prove to be a busy one for the summer school program with sixty-eight different courses being offered.
- The NJDOE released 2011 graduation rates. The formula has changed to provide a more accurate depiction of graduates in four years. Columbia High School had a 91.9% graduation rate under the new methodology.

Goal 2

- We now have an agreement with Teachscape for proficiency training for administrators.
- 360 Degree Feedback Tool for the superintendent is being completed by principals and the Senior Leadership Team. 360 Degree Feedback Tool for principals is in progress.
- Professional Development Singapore Math is being implemented for grades K-2 next year and grades 3-5 the following year with continued training being offered.
- National Board Certification not too late to sign up.

 Many Professional Development opportunities will be available for staff this summer, including technology.

Goal 3

- 95% of families participated in the new spring parent-teacher conferences.
- Meetings were held for elementary staff regarding the Special Education new K-2 program.
- ${}^{\blacksquare}$ On May $7^{\rm th}$ a meeting was held regarding the addition to MMS providing an opportunity for neighbors to ask questions.
- Satisfaction Surveys have been disseminated and results are pending.

Goal 4

- A grant application was submitted to NJDOE requesting funds to cover expenses related to the new Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying (HIB) law.
- Re-registration of all 10th graders is complete; a resolution to remove thirty students and their siblings from our roles will be approved tonight because the families have not completed the reregistration process.
- Summer construction projects and related staff and program relocation plans are in progress.

Mrs. Daugherty explained that the list of employee renewals will be presented and voted upon tonight but the Board cannot comment on personnel issues and will be voting solely on the renewal list presented for consideration.

WHEREAS, the NJSBA, acting as Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System, determined that Hess Corporation was the lowest responsible bidder, and awarded Hess Corporation the bid for a 24-month contract to serve the district's natural gas accounts commencing on the meter read date in June, 2012.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, Cheryl Schneider, Board Secretary, is hereby authorized to enter into the Natural Gas Supply Service Purchase and Sales Agreement with Hess Corporation, awarded by the NJSBA on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System, E88-01-ACESCPS, for the 24-month period commencing June 2012.
