BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Hon. Mila Jasey

 The Columbia High School Girls Track and Field Team won the State North Jersey Section 2, Group 4 Championships, under the leadership of Coach Lisa Morgan. Top scorers include freshman Olivia Baker who won the 400-meter and 800-meter runs and was part of the winning 4x400-meter relay. Olivia ran the 400-meter in 54.96, the fastest time in the state in that event this season. Other CHS top winners include Whitney Jackson in the 200-meter dash, Kayann Richards in the 100-meter hurdles and Danielle England in the javelin.

2. Columbia High School seniors were accepted at some of the most prestigious top tier colleges and universities. To date, a number of Columbia students were accepted at Ivy League and Seven Sister schools including Barnard (2), Brown (3), Bryn Mawr (1), Columbia (2), Harvard (5), Princeton (2), Smith (1), University of Pennsylvania (2), Vassar (1), Wellesley (1), and Yale (4). Others were accepted at top schools such as American (9), Bennington (2), Boston University(8), Boston College (1), Bowdoin (1), Brandeis (2), Carnegie Mellon (3), College of William and Mary(1), Duke (2), Emory (1), Franklin and Marshall (2), Georgetown (1) Hampshire (2), Haverford (1), Howard (8), Ithaca (13), James Madison (7), Johns Hopkins (4), Lafayette (3), Lehigh (4), London School of Economics (1), MIT (1), McGill (1), Middlebury (1), NJIT (8), NYU (9) Oberlin (3), Penn State (22), Pratt (3), Rutgers (53), Skidmore (4), Spellman (5), Stanford (2), Syracuse (10), Temple (16), The College of New Jersey (10), The George Washington University (9), Tufts (1), Tulane (9), Union College (4), University of California - Berkeley

(2), University of California - Los Angeles (1), University of Connecticut (4), University of Delaware (10), University of Maryland (14), University of Massachusetts (13), University of Michigan (6), University of Pittsburgh (15), University of Rochester (3), University of Vermont (20), University of Wisconsin (4), Vanderbilt (1) Wesleyan (3) and Williams (1), just to name a few.

- 3. Columbia High School junior Ian Kenselaar received two major music awards. The first was the Groningen Award to study jazz for a week at the Prince Claus Conservatoire at the Hanze University Groningen, in Groningen, the Netherlands. This award was made available through the Wells Fargo Jazz for Teens program at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center. Ian's second award was the NJ Governor's Award in Arts Education for Excellence in Jazz.
- 4. Columbia High School senior DeShawn Gray received a music scholarship from Widener University for \$5,000 renewable for each academic year. He won the scholarship based on the musical talent he demonstrated on his tuba at an audition. The scholarship is not for students majoring in music but for those who display a great talent and a sincere interest in continuing to play their chosen instrument.
- 5. Columbia High School junior Sean Hack was accepted into the 2010-2011 All-State Wind Ensemble and the 2011-2012 All State Orchestra, the premier music groups in New Jersey. Sean was accepted into these two ensembles after competing against other top trumpet players and placing fifth in the state. The All State groups performed in a concert at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center.
- 5. Five Columbia High School students were selected for the Inaugural Essex County Honor Band and performed in a concert at Bloomfield High School. The musicians were nominated by their respective band directors and 100 Honor Band members were chosen. Included were Columbia High School students Carly Rosenblatt on flute, Jonathan Schneider on B flat clarinet, Harry Schneiderman on alto saxophone, Sean Hack on trumpet and Deshawn Gray on tuba.
- 6. Columbia High School sophomore Jake McNamara was accepted into the Hampshire College Summer Studies in Mathematics program (HCSSiM). According to Jake's AP Calculus BC teacher, Mr. Mani Arguelles, this is arguably the most respected summer school for math in the country. It is a residential program for mathematically talented high school students. The students are immersed in topics such as number theory, fractals, topology, etc. for six weeks. The students work with distinguished professors and scholars from leading universities and industry.
- 7. Columbia High School freshman Jordan Avello received an Honorable Mention in the Italian I National Italian Test. The high school competition is sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of Italian. Jordan is in Mr. Bernardo Petrocelli's Italian 1 class.
- Columbia High School recognized 167 seniors with awards for outstanding accomplishments in 85 categories at its 2011 Senior Recognition Night. Students received awards for a wide variety of

achievements including academic scholarship, school and community volunteerism, athletics and physical education, music and art.

9. The 53<sup>rd</sup> Annual Men of Essex Program honored six Columbia High School students at its 2011 Essex Awards Dinner where the group recognizes Essex County's best and brightest high school athlete-scholars.

Columbia High School senior Brian Kaneshige received the top award and was named the 2011 Essex Award Winner. Brian is a four-time All-State Fencer and has been recognized for his fencing accomplishments both nationally and internationally. He will attend Harvard University in the fall.

Columbia High School senior Kayann Richards was named Athlete of the Year in Girls Track. She will attend University of Miami on a full scholarship.

Four Columbia seniors were named Essex Achievement Scholars. No other high school had more than one student named. The Columbia students include Benjamin Donald, who will attend Harvard University, Chinedu Nwafili, undecided, Aanuoluwapo Oyefesobi, undecided, and William C. Vaughan, who will attend Yale University.

- 10. The Maplewood Middle School Seventh and Eighth Grade Select Chorus, under the direction of Mrs. Regina Bradshaw, was awarded the highest rating of "Superior" at the High Note Festival in Freehold, NJ on May 27. This is the eighth consecutive year of top honors for the Chorus, consisting of approximately 35 students who also sing in the Seventh and Eighth Grade Full Chorus. The judges were impressed with their love of music and dedication to excellence as well as their seventh grade piano accompanist, Nathan Maher Levy.
- 11. Clinton School Teachers Susan Froelich, Joe Ferriero, Joanna Leach, and Yalonda Kirkland were selected to participate in the ExxonMobil Exploration and the American Geological Institute's Fourth Annual Leadership Academy in Earth Science for elementary school teachers in Houston, Texas on June 19-24, 2011. They were four of only 28 teachers selected from across the country. The Academy provides teachers with earth science content, hands-on activities, resources and field experiences that they can use with their students in the classroom and with their colleagues in professional development settings.
- 12. The American Dairy Association invited Ms. Patricia Johnson, district director of food services, to be part of a forum to help other area school districts improve and expand their nutrition and fitness initiatives. Ms. Johnson was one of only twenty-five directors in New Jersey to be selected.

Superintendent of Schools Brian Osborne successfully completed his dissertation entitled "A qualitative study of one district's efforts to improve mathematics instruction to scale" and received a doctoral degree from Harvard University on May 26, 2011. His doctoral degree is

in Administration, Planning and Social Policy with a concentration in the Urban Superintendents Program. Dr. Osborne holds two master's degrees, one in Policy and Administration from Harvard and another in Mathematics Education from New York University.

Goal 1

- Read the list of summer programs and mentioned the online credit recovery option this year.
- Special Education teachers have been submitting proposals on ways to use IPAD's for students. The district is partnering with APPLE for training and is starting pilot programs.
- Mr. Woolard, Supervisor of Educational Media & Technology, and Columbia High School Dean Taylor took students from the Bridge to Success program to New York City to experience an APPLE workshop that connects school to career. The field trip was sponsored by The United Way.
- Sixth grade mathematics is still being reviewed to see results versus scheduling.

Goal 2

- A survey has gone out to staff members asking for feedback about their experiences with the new evaluation tool.
- Five more teachers have shown interest in the National Board Certification.
- The monitoring report on the district's hiring process is before the Board.

### Goal 3

- Initial results of the customer service satisfaction survey will be presented.
- The 2011-12 school calendar has been revised and a resolution to amend it is before the Board tonight.

### Goal 4

- Opportunities review with District Management Council of special education operations beginning over this summer.
- The transition from Temco to Aramark for custodial services is going smoothly. Aramark is to take over on July 1.
- The district is taking advantage of refinancing bonds resolution to approve is before the Board this evening.
- The After School Program is under discussion with partners for next year.
- Summer construction projects are the installation of air conditioning in the high school auditorium, security gates at the middle schools and high school, field lighting at Underhill Sports Complex and other smaller projects.

Seth Wolin Commented that the entrance for students coming back into the high school after lunch is congested and it would be helpful to have more than one entry.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education deems it desirable and necessary to issue School Refunding Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$7,000,000 (the "Bonds") for the purposes and from the sources set forth in the Refunding Ordinance and it is deemed advisable and in the best interests of the Board of Education to provide for the sale, form and other matters in connection with such Bonds and the refunding of the Prior Bonds.

Both principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, which will act as Securities Depository. The certificates will be on deposit with The Depository Trust Company. The Depository Trust Company will be responsible for maintaining a book entry system for recording the interests of its participants or the transfers of the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records recording the beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds on behalf of individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$5,000 or any multiple thereof (provided that such minimum amount of the Bonds in excess of the largest principal amount thereof equaling a multiple of \$5,000 will be in the denomination of \$1,000 or any integral multiple thereof) through book entries made on the books and records of The Depository Trust Company and its participants. The Bonds will bear interest payable semiannually on the Interest Payment Dates set forth below until maturity at a rate per annum, expressed in a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1% as proposed by the successful bidder in accordance with the Notice of Sale authorized herein. The principal of and the interest on the Bonds will be paid to the Securities Depository by the Board of Education on the respective maturity dates and due dates and will be credited on the respective maturity dates and due dates to the participants of The Depository Trust Company as listed on the records of The Depository Trust Company as of the fifteenth day next preceding the respective Interest Payment Date or such earlier dates as may be required by The Depository Trust Company (the "Record Dates" for the Bonds).

The following matters are hereby determined with respect to the Bonds:

Dated Date of Bonds: Date of Delivery Interest Payment Dates: Commencing January 15, 2012 and each July 15 and January 15 thereafter until maturity on January 15, 20\_ or earlier redemption of the Bonds. Place of Payment: Cede & Co., New York, New York

SECTION 4. <u>Redemption</u>. The Bonds maturing prior to January 15, 2022 are not subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities. The Bonds maturing on or after January 15, 2022 are redeemable at the option of the Board of Education in whole or in part, on any date on or after January 15, 2021, at par, plus unpaid accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

SECTION 5. <u>Payment of Bonds</u>. The principal of and interest on the Bonds will be paid to DTC on each due date and each interest payment date.

SECTION 6. Execution of Bonds. The Bonds shall be executed in the name of the Board of Education by the manual or facsimile signature of the President or any Vice President of the Board of Education and the seal of the Board of Education shall be affixed, imprinted, engraved or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary of the Board of Education. If any officer whose signature appears on the Bonds ceases to hold office before the delivery of the Bonds, as the case may be, his or her signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes. In addition, the Bonds may bear the signature of, or may be signed by, such persons as at the actual time of the signing of such Bonds, as the case may be, shall be the proper officers to sign such Bonds although at the date of such Bonds, as the case may be, such persons may not have been such officers.

SECTION 7. <u>Appointment of Securities Depository</u>. The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), shall act as securities depository for the Bonds. The ownership of one fully registered bond for each maturity of the Bonds each in the aggregate principal amount of such maturity, will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for DTC.

Pursuant to the book-entry only system, any person for whom a DTC Participant acquires an interest in the Bonds (the "Beneficial Owner") will not receive certificated Bonds and will not be the original owner Ownership interests in the Bonds may be purchased by or thereof. through DTC Participants. Each DTC Participant will receive a credit balance in the records of DTC in the amount of such DTC Participant's interest in the Bonds, as the case may be, which will be confirmed in accordance with DTC's standard procedures. The appropriate officers of the Board of Education are hereby authorized to execute Letters of Representation to DTC and such other documents as may be necessary or desirable in connection with DTC's services as securities depository.

DTC may determine to discontinue providing its services with respect to the Bonds at any time by giving notice to the Board of Education and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto under applicable law. Under such circumstances the Board of Education shall designate a successor securities depository or deliver certificates to the beneficial owners of the Bonds, as the case may be.

SECTION 8. <u>Ownership of Bonds</u>. The Board of Education and any Paying Agent may treat and consider DTC as the holder and absolute owner of any Bond, whether such Bond shall be overdue or not, for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal of or interest thereon and for all other purposes whatsoever.

SECTION 9. Form of Bonds. Subject to the provisions of this Resolution, the Bonds shall be in initially the following form, with such omissions insertions, endorsements and variations as may be required by the circumstances and be required or permitted by this Resolution or as may be consistent with this Resolution and necessary or appropriate to conform to the rules and requirements of any governmental authority or any usage or requirement of law with respect thereto:

The Bonds subject to redemption shall be redeemed at 100% of the principal amount to be redeemed, plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

If the Board of Education determines to redeem a portion of the Bonds prior to maturity, such Bonds shall be redeemed in any order determined by the Board of Education, and within any maturity, by lot.

The full faith and credit of the Board of Education are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on this Bond according to its terms.

In the event the Board of Education determines that it is in the best interests of the beneficial owners of the Bonds (the actual purchasers of the Bonds) that they be able to obtain certificated Bonds, the Board of Education may notify The Depository Trust Company ("DTC") of the availability of Bond certificates. In such event, the Board of Education will appoint a paying agent and the Board of Education will issue, transfer and exchange Bond certificates as required by DTC and others in appropriate amounts. DTC may determine to discontinue providing its services with respect to the Bonds at any time by giving a reasonable amount of notice in writing to the Board of Education and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto. In the event of such determination, if the Board of Education fails to identify another qualified securities depository as successor to DTC, the Board of Education will appoint a paying agent and the Board of Education will issue and deliver replacement Bonds in the form of fully registered certificates. Whenever DTC requests the Board of Education to do so, the Board of Education will cooperate with DTC in taking appropriate action (a) to make available one or more separate certificates evidencing the Bonds to any participant of DTC having Bonds credited to its DTC account or (b) to arrange for another securities depository to maintain custody of certificates evidencing the Bonds.

In as much as the Bonds are refunding bonds, after a request for qualifications conducted by the Business Administrator of the School District, the Board of Education hereby appoints RBC Capital Markets, LLC to serve as the underwriter for the Bonds. SECTION 11. <u>Pledge of Board of Education</u>. The full faith and credit of the Board of Education is hereby pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said Bonds and said Bonds shall be general obligations of the Board of Education payable as to principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be assessed on the taxable property within said School District without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 12. <u>Bond Insurance</u>. The Business Administrator is authorized and empowered to take all action necessary to obtain municipal bond insurance for the issuance of the Bonds, if in the discretion of the Business Administrator it is deemed advantageous to obtain municipal bond insurance.

SECTION 13. <u>Investment of Proceeds of Bonds</u>. The Board of Education will make no use of the proceeds of the Bonds which would cause the Bonds to be arbitrage bonds; and the Board of Education hereby imposes on itself and all officers having custody or control of the proceeds of the Bonds, throughout the term of the Bonds, the obligation to comply with applicable requirements of Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and Regulations Sections 1.148.0 through 1.148-11 and 1.150-0 and 1.150-1, and all other applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code, so that the Bonds will not be or become arbitrage bonds.

SECTION 14. Tax Covenants Relating to the Tax Reform Act of 1986. In order to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest on the Bonds, and for no other purpose, the Board of Education covenants to comply with each applicable requirement of the Code, applicable to the Bonds, and any technical corrections thereto applicable to the Bonds, and the Board of Education covenants not to take any action or fail to take any action which would cause the interest on the Bonds to lose the exclusion from gross income for federal income taxation purposes under Section 103 of the Code.

The Board of Education covenants and agrees with the holders of the Bonds that the Board of Education shall not take any action or omit to take any action, which action or omission, if reasonably expected on the date of initial issuance and delivery of the Bonds, would cause the Bonds to be "private activity bonds" or "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Sections 141(a) and 148, respectively, of the Code, or any successor provision. The appropriate representatives of the Board of Education are authorized to execute and deliver to Wolff & Samson PC, Bond Counsel, a tax and arbitrage certificate with respect to the Bonds and the Prior Bonds.

SECTION 15. Bonds Not Federally Guaranteed. The Board of Education covenants that it will take no action which would cause the Bonds to be federally guaranteed (within the meaning of Section 149 of the Code).

SECTION 16. <u>Continuing Disclosure</u>. The Business Administrator of the Board of Education is hereby authorized to execute and deliver to the successful bidder for the Bonds an undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities Exchange Commission. SECTION 17. <u>Printing</u>. The Underwriter and/or the Business Administrator are authorized to arrange for the printing of the Bonds and the printing of the Official Statement to be prepared by the Underwriter and the Business Administrator and to arrange for the distribution of the Preliminary Official Statements on behalf of the Board of Education to those financial institutions that customarily submit bids for such Bonds. The President or Vice President and the Secretary and/or Assistant Secretary are authorized to execute the Official Statement and any certificates necessary in connection with the distribution of the Official Statement.

SECTION 18. All Necessary Action. On behalf of the Board of Education, the appropriate representatives of the Board of Education are authorized and directed to take all steps which are necessary or convenient to effectuate the terms of the Refunding Ordinance and the terms of this Resolution with respect to the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds and the refunding of the Prior Bonds, including, without limitation, the preparation and distribution of a preliminary official statement and final official statement, the preparation, execution and delivery of the Bonds in definitive form, the preparation, execution and delivery of an escrow deposit agreement with a bank or other depository authorized to serve as escrow agent for the receipt of the proceeds of the Bonds and the payment of the Prior Bonds and the execution and delivery of all documents deemed necessary by Wolff & Samson PC, Bond Counsel, and the Underwriter.
