PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Mr. Osborne

1. The National College Board has announced that a total of 122 current Columbia High School students and 2010 graduates have received Advanced Placement (AP) Scholar Awards for the number of AP courses completed and the high scores received on the AP Exams taken at the end of the course. This is a record number of AP Scholar awards won by Columbia students.

The test is scored on a five-point scale with 5 being the highest grade. The College Board AP Program offers students the opportunity to take challenging college-level courses while still in high school and, when the student enters college, receive actual college credit and advanced placement. About 18 percent of the 1.7 million students in almost 16,000 secondary schools worldwide who took AP Exams performed at a high enough level to merit such recognition.

In 2010, Columbia students took $652\ AP$ Exams as compared to 1998 when only 296 AP Exams were taken.

National AP Scholar

Three Columbia students, William Barkalow*, Geoffrey Marino* and Carlyn Messinger*, all 2010 graduates, were awarded this honor after earning an AP Exam grade average of 4 on all AP Exams taken and grades of 4 or 5 on eight or more of these exams.

days at the Hunter Movie Theater in the Village of Hunter, NY. This international festival is open to teenagers from around the world and included entries from Argentina, Croatia and Israel. Daniel's teacher is Mr. Boris Gavrilovic.

- 3. The Columbia High School Special Dance Company, under the direction of dance instructor Kandice Point-Du-Jour, was invited to perform at the Burgdorff Cultural Center at a community event called "Two Towns Dance In." It was sponsored by the South Orange/Maplewood Community Coalition on Race and also included two locally-based dance companies.
- 4. Jefferson Elementary School was awarded a grant by The New Jersey State Parent Information and Resource Center (NJPIRC) to enhance the school's parent involvement efforts. The grant was written by Principal Susan Grierson and the Jefferson PTA
- 5. Supervisor of Health, Physical Education and Nursing Services Judy LoBianco was recently featured in an article called "To Each Their Own" in a national publication called Strategies, A Journal for Physical and Sport Educators. The article explained how students in this district are participating in individually-oriented PE activities made possible by electronic tools. Students are using Polar heart rate monitors, beginning in grade four, and integrated health assessment systems in high school to help them monitor their own physical performance and progress.
- 6. South Mountain School Principal Tina Lehn was invited to be a panelist at a conference held by the Columbia School of Journalism. The audience had to apply to be accepted to attend and consisted of 50 working journalists, who usually cover education. The topic of the conference was "Persistence of the Racial Achievement Gap," moderated by NPR journalist Nancy Solomon. Ms. Lehn spoke on the topic "A View from the Trenches: The Challenges of Diverse Classrooms," and was joined on the panel by noted educators Ronald Ferguson, Gloria Ladson-Billings, Annette Lareau, and Claude Steele.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT ON DISTRICT GOALS

- A detailed report on state AP test scores using growth model by internal sections was given.
- A report on the results of Read 180 academic intervention was given. Quantitative results are what we wanted to see. Thanks to those supporting the initiative.
- Curriculum for grades K-10 is now on the district website.

- Elementary curriculum presentations for parents.
- Substantial work on anti-bullying has been initiated.

Goal 2

- Merit pay for ASCA members will align adult pay with student outcome. 2009-10 student outcomes and evaluations are being used.
- Smart Board Users Conference was held at Columbia High School and 68 of the 201 participants were our district teachers.
- Continuing overhaul of evaluation system is taking place.
 Time intensive process.

Goal 3

- The district is now tweeting; activities can be followed on Twitter.
- School Messenger is increasingly being used to keep the school community informed.
- Parent-Teacher conferences were held with at least 90% participation in all grades at all schools.
- Parent Portal is open for secondary students. Grades are being posted there.
- Achieve Foundation has new leadership with Jeaniene Brownlee as the new Volunteer Tutor Program Coordinator.

Goal 4

- State changed the timeline for the 2009-10 audit this year. It will be presented at the December meeting.
- Karla Milanette announced her retirement. The process for posting a replacement was described.

DISCUSSION

Initial 2011-12 Baseline Data Analysis - Ms. Milanette

Business Administrator, Karla Milanette described the budget process by presenting a summary of the data used to develop the 2011-12 budget including Enrollment Projections, Low Income Students, Transported Students, Salaries and Benefits, School Facilities, Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (audit) and Management Discussion and Analysis, General Fund Free Balance Status and Budget Calendar and Priorities [report is posted on the district website].

Current Enrollment - Ms. Schneider

Assistant Business Administrator, Cheryl Schneider presented an update of enrollment and the outcome of the district's redistricting effort. Space continues to be tight at the elementary level, however, redistricting that affected Tuscan and South Mountain schools allowed the district to avoid the expense of creating additional classrooms. It is anticipated that in 2013-14 there will be a large increase at the middle school level when the present-day elementary students have moved to higher grades.

Analysis of Variability of Student Performance and Report on Advanced Placement Results - Mr. Roth

Chief Information Officer, Paul Roth presented an analysis of AP test scores that focused on participation and results by school year, measuring student learning outcomes considering district resources and growth models [power point presentation is on file in Board Secretary's office].

2011-12 School Calendar - Mr. Osborne

Superintendent Osborne presented four options for the 2011-12 school calendar. The presentation was followed by a discussion among Board members.

Updates were given by the Chairs of the Policy, Curriculum, Finance, Facilities, and Engagement and Outreach committees.
