A Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of South Orange-Maplewood was held in the District Meeting Room at the Administration Building, 525 Academy Street, Maplewood, New Jersey, on April 25, 2011.

Board President Mark Gleason called the meeting to order at 7:50 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Mr. Osborne

- 1. The Foreign Language Educators of New Jersey awarded a college scholarship worth \$1,000 to CHS senior Carsonie Legerme after she excelled in a written and oral French competition. Carsonie received a letter from the organization stating, "You should feel very proud of your linguistic accomplishments since you competed with other outstanding world language students throughout the state." The letter also included an invitation to attend the FLENJ Annual Conference where the winners were honored. Carsonie was accompanied to the dinner by her very proud CHS French teacher Ms. Cathi Politi.
- 2. The Columbia High School Chess Team won first place in the New Jersey High School Chess Championship 2011 Junior Varsity competition. The team competed against 11 others to win the tournament held at Brookdale College. The CHS team members include sophomores Neil Miller, Russell Wong, Miguel O'Malley, and Francois Sissoko. The advisor to the group is CHS special education teacher Janet Kahn. Neil won all five of his games garnering the trophy for best individual performance, and Russell won four of his five games.
- 3. A Montrose Learning Center student group, Tros Organics and its advisor, Inclusion Teacher Smita Dharsi, were recently invited to present their organic gardening and marketing project to the renowned scientist Dr. Jane Goodall at the Liberty Science Center. After meeting with Dr. Goodall, the students attended Dr. Goodall's lecture in the Center's IMax theatre and viewed her documentary on 50 years in the Gombe National Park. Ms. Dharsi has worked with the Tros Organics group this year to create a sustainable schoolyard

- garden. The student group is partnering with the Maplewood Community Gardeners and several community businesses to spearhead a summer initiative project.
- 4. Columbia High School math students, individually, and the CHS Math Team received top rankings in competitions, under the direction of Ms. Pam Noonan, CHS mathematics teacher and competition advisor. More than 29 CHS students participated in the American Mathematics Competition (AMC), a record number for Columbia. CHS sophomore Adam Richardson scored in the top 2.5 percent of the nation in the AMC Tenth Grade and Below Division, and CHS senior Sarah Brauner scored in the top 5 percent in the Twelfth Grade and Below Division. The competitions serve as qualifiers for the American Invitational Mathematics Exam (AIME), and Adam and Sarah both scored high enough for acceptance. The CHS Math Team entered the New Jersey Math League Competition (NJML), a six-session event. To date, after the 5th round, Columbia is ranked third in Essex County and tenth in the state, competing against almost 200 public and private school teams. Two sophomores on the team, Jake McNamara and Adam Richardson, have near perfect scores.
- 5. Columbia High School Senior Jack Sorokin was selected as a finalist in the Serbin Communications 31st Annual Student Photography Contest, sponsored by Nikon, USA. Over 3500 students participated from the US, Canada, and around the world. Mr. Jon Fisher is Jack's photography teacher at CHS.
- 6. Ms. Judy LoBianco, Supervisor of Physical Education, Nursing Services and Health, was invited to speak at two national conventions this month. The first was the National Physical Education Convention in San Diego where she spoke to the nation's physical education supervisors on leadership in her field. The second was the National School Boards Association in San Francisco where she addressed the importance of coordinated school health.
- 7. Track Coach Lisa Morgan has recently received three accolades for her outstanding work as a track and field coach.
 - Coach Morgan was featured in *Coaching Management* magazine in an article called "Maximizing Individual Performance." In the article, she was lauded for leading the girls' squads to NJ State Interscholastic Association Group 4 state championships, setting state records and maximizing the performance of her athletes.
 - Coach Morgan was named National Federation of State High School Associations 2010 Sectional Coach of the Year Girls Track and Field for her "outstanding service and unselfish devotion to interscholastic activities."
 - Coach Morgan was appointment by USA Track and Field (the governing body of track and field in the United States) as the Distance Coach for the World Youth Championship Team going to France in July, 2011. She was one of only eight coaches (and the only female) to be selected out of the 1,000 coaches who applied.
- 8. CHS senior Brian Kaneshige, and the other three members of the USA Junior National Men's Foil Team, won the Gold Medal in the 2011 Junior Fencing World Championships in Amman, Jordan. The USA team

was victorious over the powerful Italian team in a tightly contested final gold medal bout, after earlier wins over the national teams from Ukraine, Korea, and France.

9. A number of Columbia High School winter sports teams excelled in their division. Included are:

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE

Goal 1

- There will be two resolutions before the Board tonight for online courses. One would give students increased access through online learning beginning in the fall, at the district's expense, and an online summer school program for credit recovery, at the student's expense.
- Twenty-three proposals for special education use of Ipads were received and are being reviewed.
- April is Autism Awareness Month. Currently the district has 83 students with autism enrolled. The first group of students in inclusion classes at Marshall School will enter middle school in the fall. The district has a partnership with Morris Union Jointure Commission that provides a consultant who interacts with district teachers.
- A proposal is being created for middle schools that would introduce a choice of electives in 7th and 8th grades.
- The Shakespeare Festival was wonderful and appreciation was extended to all involved.

Goal 2

- Summative evaluations for non-tenured staff have now been completed. The process is aligned to Framework.
- The district is piloting the use of Val-Ed for non-tenured principals.
- Thanks was offered to the staff members who participated in the sustainability conference at Seton Hall.
- Acknowledgement and thanks were expressed to SOMEA for sponsoring with CHS HSA, an awareness and prevention of bullying and harassment program.

Goal 3

• The strategic communications plan is in the final phase and should be available at the next Board meeting. Satisfaction surveys will be administered in the next few weeks.

Goal 4

- The latest custodial survey information is being tabulated. Custodial Services has been approved for competitive contracting and a new agreement should be brought to the Board at the next Board meeting.
- Bids have been solicited for a new auditing company.
- Higher speed internet will be available soon.

Mr. Wolin suggested that surveys be emailed directly to students.

Comments regarding both teachers were that they are both excellent teachers, students are happy and learning, and parents are surprised and confused by the decision to non-renew them.

Board President Gleason clarified the timing of non-renewal procedures that is driven by state law, and expressed his appreciation to all who spoke. He also explained that staff renewal decisions are not the Board's but lie with the administrators.

Although Mr. Laine is not present this evening, Mr. Gleason publicly thanked him for his service on the Board since 2006.

Board recessed at 9:50 p.m. Board reconvened at 10:05 p.m.

DISCUSSION

Adopt Budget and Action by the Board of School Estimate

The Board will adopt the 2011-12 budget tonight that has been approved by the Board of School Estimate. The tax levy will be a 1.89% increase over last year.

Board Self Evaluation - Mr. Gleason

Mr. Gleason presented the Board goals and progress toward achievement of the goals. The presentation was followed by a brief discussion among Board members [on file in Board Secretary's office].

Committee Reports

Finance - Mrs. Wren-Hardin

It was reported that during the process of having the Board of School Estimate approve the budget, the superintendent proposed changing the budget process to work more closely with the Board of School Estimate. The finance committee will review that proposal and committee level changes.

Facilities and Technology - Mrs. Daugherty

- The results of the custodial service surveys were generally positive. Many comments from the high school were regarding litter and student behavior. There will be an interview panel to review custodial services proposals.
- Long Range Facility Plan will be extended to identify facility improvements to meet the needs of 21st century teaching and learning for the next twenty years. Efficiencies in energy consumption and overall greening of facilities will also be reviewed.
- There is a resolution to rescind the After School Program contract until further review.

Mr. Wolin suggested that professional learning communities be established at each school relative to "green" initiatives.

Outreach and Communication - Ms. Karriem

- A satisfaction survey will be distributed in May and the committee hopes to report the results in June.
- Strategic communication plan will be presented to the Board in May.
- There was no committee meeting in April so there is no update on Power School or School Messenger.

Curriculum - Ms. Crawford

No report.

Essex Regional Education Service Commission is in negotiations and ready to declare an impasse.

Policy - Dr. Payne-Parrish

No report.

Policy 2440 Summer Session - second reading will be this evening.

Ms. deKoninck explained that the district is now allowed to charge a fee in some instances for summer school and will begin doing so this summer.

Mr. Osborne commented that committees are usually created at the Organizational Meeting but this year a new way of structuring committees will be discussed.

Charter School Applications

The Board discussed the possible financial impact of charter schools in the area.
