BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Mr. Osborne

1. Six district teachers have achieved the status of National Board Certification by meeting rigorous standards through intensive study, expert evaluation, self-assessment and peer review. Included are: Liz Azukas - MMS Cathrine Evans - Marshall Susan Froelich - Clinton Lynn Kelly - Seth Boyden

With last year's recipients, David Feldman, Laurence Seltzer and Katie Simpson, the district now has nine National Board Certified Teachers.

According to The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, National Board Certified Teachers are highly accomplished educators who meet rigorous standards to improve their teaching and their students' learning. Since 1987 74,000 teachers have achieved this goal and are ready to prepare children with the skills needed to compete in the 21<sup>st</sup> century workplace.

The district is offering support for anyone interested in achieving this certification. There are currently nine staff members in the process of applying for this outstanding accomplishment.

2. Film projects created by six Columbia High School students were chosen as semi-finalists at the Derek Freese National Film and Video Competition held annually at Temple University in Philadelphia. The Festival is sponsored by the Derek Freese Foundation, Greater Philadelphia Film Office, Sony, Focal Press, Glidecam and Temple University Film and Media Arts Department. Winning student filmmakers, all under the direction of CHS film and animation teacher Boris Gavrilovic, include: William Sokoloski for clay-animation "Blob Wars" Emily Schnorr for clay-animation "Picnic" Sam Skoller for 16mm experimental film "Repeat Offenses" Ethan Oberman, Chris Robins and Grace Gifford for 16mm experimental film "O Captain My Captain."

- 3. Columbia High School's student newspaper, The Columbian, received a Gold Medalist Ranking from the Columbia University Scholastic Press Association. Editions of the 2009-2010 publication were entered into the annual competition and critiqued in four categories. The newspaper received top All-Columbian Honors in "Coverage" and "Graphic Presentation" and high honors in "Writing and Editing" and "Business Operations." One judge commented, "The paper is exciting to look at, every single issue." Another stated, "The staff builds momentum and excitement over the year. The results are full of life, verve and impact." Ms. Cindy Malhotra, graphic arts teacher and Ms. Jan McGrane, journalism teacher, are advisors to The Columbian. The 09-10 editors were CHS graduates Co-Editors-in-Chief Emma Gilheany and Olivia Karten; Co-Design Editors Hillary Hersh and Jenna Mercadante; Photo Editor Soleil Garnaeu; and Art Editor Alexander Winkler.
- 4. Columbia High School Track Coach Lisa Morgan was honored by the Executive Committee of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association for outstanding service and dedication to the student athletes of New Jersey. She was honored at the organization's annual dinner earlier this month. Coach Morgan recently led the CHS Girls Track Team to the national title at the New Balance National Championships in North Carolina.
- 5. The Columbia High School Football Team, under the leadership of Coach Dave Curtin, who was selected Worrall Coach of the Year, and Assistant Coaches Rick Pinto, Luther Bowen, Eugene Kline, Andrew Rowe, Kevin Green and Matt Mitchell ended the season with a 9-1 record, making it the team with the most wins in the history of Columbia football. The players averaged 31.6 points a game, while only allowing 12.2 points a game.

Senior Captain Denzel Nieves led the team with a season total of 1,229 yards rushing and 22 touchdowns. Denzel was selected Worrall Offensive Player of the Year and named to the Star-Ledger All-Essex First Team Offense. Other stars of the season included seniors Demitrius Cooper, Matt McGriff, Odelson Julien and Junior Captain Jordan Davis. Matt was named to the Star-Ledger All-Essex First Team Defense.

The notice of the public hearing and the resolution shall include a statement that the resolution will be on file and open to examination to the public between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. at the office of the Board Secretary/School Business Administrator from the date of such notice until the date of the public hearing.

Section 5. This resolution shall also constitute a declaration of intent by the Board of Education to issue tax-exempt bonds for the purpose of paying expenditures for the Improvement Projects pursuant to Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
