THE 2024-2025 PROPOSED BUDGET

### A UNIQUE BUDGET SEASON

Dear Neighbors,

As a resident and taxpayer, your unwavering support is appreciated.

This year, we faced a significant challenge when Governor Hochul's Executive Budget proposed a \$3.4 million cut in Foundation Aid to the Sayville School District. A cut of this magnitude would have been extremely detrimental to our district. The Sayville Board of Education instructed administration to meticulously examine this year's Proposed Budget. The goal was to maintain programs as much as possible and minimize the aid reduction's impact on students and staff.

The district and community united, advocating vigorously through letters and calls to reverse the propsed cuts, and we are thankful to the teachers, families, and residents who made their voices heard and spoke out.

Thanks to these efforts, the NYS Legislature passed a revised budget restoring the \$3.4 million cut. This enabled the Board of Education to adopt a revised budget that includes restoring eleven teaching positions, reducing tax burdens, and implementing local control strategies for future aid cuts. This budget is responsible and focused on the future and aims to serve students in the best possible way.

Please examine this Budget Issue of Tidings carefully, attend the Public Hearing on May 14, at the Administration Building and remember to vote on May 21.

**SUMMATION:** The Sayville Board of Education adopted the **2024-2025 PROPOSED BUDGET** at its April 23rd, 2024 meeting. This Proposed Budget represents a **\$106,028,631** spending plan, resulting in a spending increase of **\$3,979,740** or **3.900%**. This translates to a proposed increase on the tax levy of **3.700%**—requiring a simple majority to pass. For the average home assessed at **\$40,000** there will be an *estimated* increase of **\$375/year** or **\$31.25/month** [see *Tidings* p.3] (before any STAR reimbursements). Carefully read through this Budget Issue of Tidings. Under the Business Office Section of the website, you may review all the Budget presentations.

Your continued support is invaluable as we strive to provide the best possible education for our students.

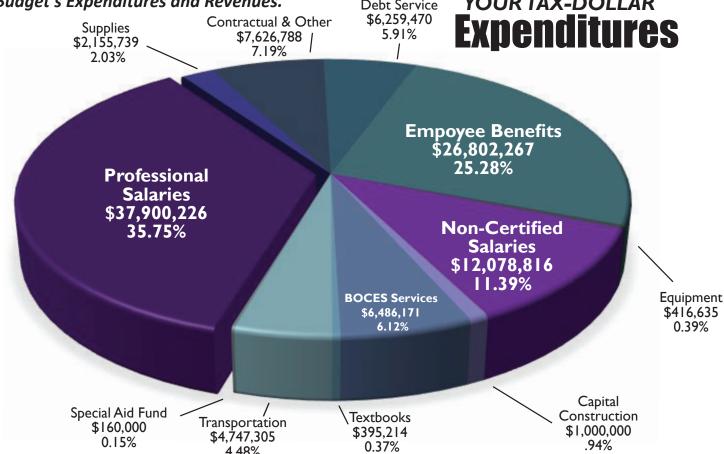

# 2024-2025 PROPOSED BUDGET EXPENDITURES & REVENUES

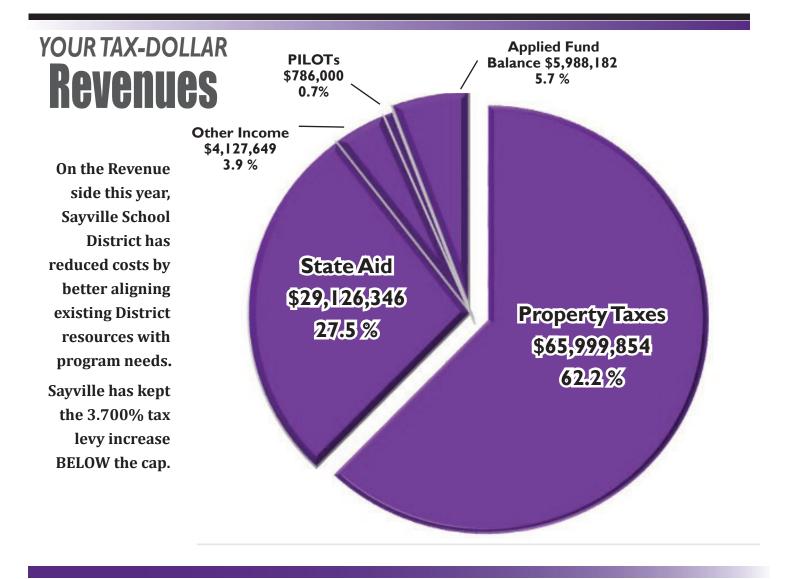
The two Pie Charts (below and opposite page) show the breakdown of the 2024-2025 Proposed Budget's Expenditures and Revenues.

Debt Service YOUR TAX-DOLLAR

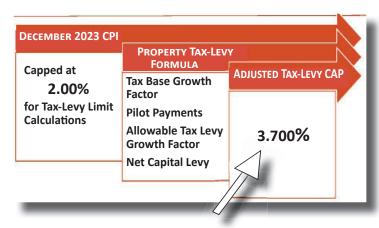


#### TRANSPORTATION

- Sayville contracts with Suffolk Transportation all student bus services
- The District obtained Requests for Proposals (RFP's) for our Large Buses, Vans, and Field Trips, and Athletic Transportation Contracts during the 2020-21 school year;
- A five-year Contract was awarded to Suffolk Transportation;
- For the 2024-25 school year, we would be in year 5 of 5;
- Benefits of a five-year Contract provide the District with cost predictability and continuity of service.



## NYS "Two Percent" Tax Cap Formula...



- An increase in the District's Debt Service drives the Tax-Levy Cap Percentage up;
- An increase from prior-year Building Aid drives down the Tax-Levy Cap Percentage.

...IS NOT "TWO PERCENT" AT ALL, SINCE THE FORMULA IS BASED UPON SEVERAL FACTORS (see chart at left).

The Projected Tax-Levy increase of 3.700% is BELOW the calculated Tax Cap requiring a simple majority to pass.

Keeping the Tax Cap Levy Calculation **BELOW** the Maximum Allowed is a further demonstration that the Sayville School District and Board of Education are presenting a **fiscally responsible budget** to taxpayers and are aware of this year's challenging budget process.

#### **NEW YORK STATE RULES REGARDING THE CONTINGENCY BUDGET**

The Contingency Budget contains various expenditures that are: legal, specifically authorized by mandates or statutes, and maintain educational programs, preserve property, maintain the health and safety of students and staff. If the Proposed Budget fails the first time...

New York school boards may decide to: put up the *SAME* budget for revote, put up a *REVISED* budget for revote; or adopt a Contingency Budget.

\*\*\*\*\*IMPORTANT INFORMATION\*\*\*\*\*

If the Proposed Budget <u>fails</u> <u>twice</u>, school districts must adopt a Contingency Budget with a ZERO percent increase on the current tax levy. Under a Contingency Budget there are *TWO* spending cap limitions:

#### 1. <u>ADMINISTRATIVE</u> CAP

ADMINISTRATIVE CAPS
are determined by taking the ratio
between the Administrative and Program
Budgets, plus determining the 'lesser' of
the calculated Administrative Caps for
2023-2024 or the defeated 2024-2025
Budget. (See chart below.)

#### 2. ZERO PERCENT TAX LEVY CAP

On a Contingency Budget, Sayville School District would have to cut \$2,354,865 from instructional/support programs, and staffing to achieve a ZERO PERCENT TAX LEVY INCREASE (See below).

# To Achieve 0% Increase What Would Be Cut? Non-contingent Items

ADMINISTRATIVE Budget ..... -\$506,149

• Staffing, nonessential supplies, equipment, travel, etc.

PROGRAM Budget......-\$272,081

 Staffing, student supplies, new equipment, athletics, cocurricular, summer school, increased class size, etc.

CAPITAL Budget ..... -\$1,576,635

 NO Community-Use of Buildings and Grounds (unless paid), staffing reductions, capital projects, etc.

# ABSENTEE/EARLY MAIL BALLOT INFORMATION

Absentee/Early Mail Ballot applications can be found on the district website.

Navigate to the Board of Education tab and then click

Board Election Info & Advocacy.

You may use the application if you are a qualified voter who resides in the school district.

You may only apply for an absentee/early mail ballot on your own behalf. If you have any questions, please contact the District Clerk at 631-244-6516.

Per the District's legal notice and in accordance with Education Law §2018-a, completed applications may not be received by the District Clerk earlier than **Monday**, **April 22**, **2024**, and such applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed by the voter, **May 14**, **2024** or the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter or the agentn named in the absentee ballot application.

Absentee. Early Mail ballot applications must be received by the District Clerk no later than 4:00 p.m., prevailing time, on Monday, May 20, 2024. Receipt of Absentee/Early Mail Ballots must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 21, 2024.

#### **VOTING REQUIREMENTS\*** To be eligible to vote on TUESDAY, MAY 21<sup>ST</sup>

ONE MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Be a U.S. citizen.
- 2. Be 18 years of age or older.
- 3. Be a resident of the Sayville School District for at least 30 days prior to the voting date.
- 4. Be registered to vote in the Sayville School District.

\*\*\*NOTE: General election registration qualifies residents.\*\*\*

### REGISTRATION Registration for new residents,

residents who have moved

within the district, and residents who have not voted in a Sayville School District election since January 1st, 2019 can register either:

#### **SUMMARY OF THE 2024-2025** PROPOSED BUDGET

This fiscally responsible spending plan is a complete budget package that:

- Has an increase in spending of 3.900%:
- **Has a Proposed Tax-Levy increase** of 3.700%;
- Is BELOW the calculated Tax-Levy cap, requiring a simple majority;
- MAINTAINS educational opportunities with engaging programs that will help students.

#### TRANSPORTATION POLICY

The Proposed Budget reflects the revised Board of Education transportation policy for elementary students which was passed by Referendum in May of 2012.



Students in the following grades, as indicated, are eligible to receive transportation.

**GRADE DISTANCE** 

K-5 Beyond 1/2 mile

Beyond 1 1/2 miles 6-12

No transportation is provided for students traveling to any school beyond 15 miles.
