**3. SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS:**

#### **4. PRINCIPALS' REPORTS:**

**4.A. Trousdale County Elementary School** - Ms. Kellie Porter, Asst Principal, provided the elementary school report in the absence of Ms. Badru, Principal. Ms. Porter highlighted the school's most recent professional development day that was held on November 5. She stated that the school's teachers worked extensively on the PreK-2<sup>nd</sup> grade portfolios, preparing for the Q2 benchmark assessments and AIMS-Web universal screening assessments that will be conducted in early January. She concluded by saying it has been a great beginning of the school year.

**4.B. Jim Satterfield Middle School** – Mr. Gulley stated that the school has been focusing on instructional urgency by monitoring and supporting classroom instruction. He stated that the school focused on academic growth conversations and on preparing for the Q2 benchmark assessments during the district's most recent professional development day that was held on November 5. He stated that student attendance has been relatively strong so far during the year. He proudly announced that Ms. Gena Cothron, Assistant Principal, was able to return to school from caring for her husband, Tennessee State Trooper, Adam Cothron,

**4.C. Trousdale County High School** – Mr. McCall discussed the school's joint collaboration in supporting the school district's and local law enforcement's "Report, Don't Repost" campaign. He stated that he had invited the SRO and law enforcement to speak to classrooms about the campaign and best practices in reporting school threats. He stated that the campaign had helped remove much of the pandemonium that has seemingly dominated social media lately. Mr. McCall also stated that the 11<sup>th</sup> grade recently completed the ASVAB assessment, and from all reports, the students think they did well. He reminded everyone that the FAFSA application opens on December 14 and that the school would be hosting a FAFSA Frenzy event at the school. Mr. McCall concluded that he is working on planning for the upcoming Tripod student surveys and closing out the most recent 2023-24 teacher evaluations while supporting classroom instruction through the use of TNTP walkthrough observations.

**4.D. Student School Board Representative** – Student representatives Hanna Tucker and Elizabeth Denning reported on the most recent Halloween costume contest, the conclusion of football season and the beginning of basketball season as the school had already participated in two Hall of Fame games. They reminded everyone that juniors and seniors will be ordering graduation caps and gowns and that the TN Promise / FAFSA application opens on December 15. They concluded by highlighting the most recent FBLA leadership workshop that was held at the Titans stadium.

**5.B. Academic and Goal Updates** – Dr. Satterfield highlighted results from the most recent Parent-Teacher Conference that was held on October 17. He stated that all parents were provided with their student’s spring TCAP/EOC results along with information about how to access the TCAP Parent Portal as well as the PowerSchool Parent portal. He stated that teachers engaged parents in a “proficiency” conversation about where their students were on the proficiency continuum. He also discussed the annual 3<sup>rd</sup> grade parent meeting that is held with all 3<sup>rd</sup> grade parents about the new Tennessee 3<sup>rd</sup> grade Literacy Success Act and key dates and timelines for parents. He concluded by reminding everyone about the school district’s “Report, Don’t Repost” campaign that is held in collaboration with the local police department. He reminded everyone that the campaign is in response to anonymous threats that are taking place nationwide and the disciplinary consequences that will be imposed for creating a substantial disruption to the learning environment.

**5.C. Project Updates** – Dr. Satterfield stated that the roofing company estimates that the elementary school roof will be completed around the last week of November or the first week in December. He stated that the contractor is beginning to move dirt on the new field house site. He stated the contractor aims to have the foundation built sometime in December.

**6. NEW BUSINESS:**

**6.A. 2024-25 School-wide Benchmark Rubric – Chronic Absenteeism Indicator**

Dr. Satterfield requested that the Board include the federal accountability Chronic Absenteeism indicator in the alternative compensation school-wide benchmark rubric for the 2024-25 school year. However, if the Board elected to remove the indicator, he requested that the Board remove the indicator altogether and not to list it anywhere on the school-wide benchmark rubric as was done in the prior 2023-24 school year. After much discussion, the Board decided to remove the Chronic Absenteeism indicator altogether from the 2024-25 alternative compensation benchmark rubric.

After a long debate about the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) indicator and its role in obtaining financial aid, and ultimately, postsecondary success for graduates, Dr. Satterfield asked the Board to consider the ACT indicator in lieu of the FAFSA indicator as a metric for postsecondary success if they could not agree on the FAFSA indicator. After much discussion about the importance of ACT, the Board agreed to accept the 2024-25 alternative compensation school-wide rubric without the FAFSA or ACT indicator at this time.
