

### PAC Goals for 2024-25

The purpose of the Committee is to support, encourage and improve the quality of education and the well-being of all students within Mt. Diablo Unified School District.

The Parent Advisory Council's mission is to engage families to help shape education policy and represent diverse parent voices in the statewide decision-making process.

The PAC is committed to helping close gaps in achievement and to create authentic engagement opportunities that will result in transformative outcomes for California students.



The purpose of this committee shall be to review, recommend, and advise the district on matters pertaining to the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) and Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF).

- Advise administration and staff on parents/families' views on any matter related to schools programs, practices policies, plans, and activities
- Communicate with parents/guardians and to promote parent/guardian engagement between home and school in providing for the education of their children
- Assist parents/families in access the system and to facilitate advocacy support for individual children and their parents/ family
- Assist in the planning, development, implementation and evaluation of the LCAP, using data to inform discussions.
- Assist with efforts to make parents aware of the district's policy and procedures
  relating to the programs and actions within the LCAP and other critical district plans.



### LCAP Goals

- All students will receive a high quality education in a safe and welcoming environment with high expectations and rigorous instruction in the California State Standards that prepare them for college and career.
- Highly qualified, culturally proficient, and responsive staff will create a safe and engaging learning environment respectful of all students' backgrounds ensuring they are college and career ready when they graduate.
- Families and community members will be informed, and empowered as partners with Mt. Diablo Unified to support student learning and improve student outcomes.
- Focal scholars, specifically African American students, Foster Youth, students experiencing homelessness, students with IEPs and multilingual students, will experience culturally responsive practices and be provided rigorous instruction within an educational environment that builds trust and inclusive partnerships between the students, families, and staff.
- All students at Crossroads High School and Olympic High School will demonstrate a 6% increase in attendance rate and a 6% increase in on-pace graduation rate by June 2026, leading to an increase of 6% in graduation rates.

#### **Funding Sources**

- Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP)
  - o Entitlement
  - o Amount based on Unduplicated students
    - Unduplicated Students:
      - Free and Reduced Lunch
      - Foster Youth
      - MultiLingual Learner (previously EL)
  - Rate fluctuates, currently at about \$1,600 per student
  - This year ~\$11,900,000
- After School Education & Safety (ASES)
  - o MDUSD has had the ASES grant since the early 2000s
  - o 14 of our 23 sites receive ASES funding
  - o 3 year renewable grant
  - Awarded a target number of students per school
  - Yearly award amount is \$3.845 million
- Title 1 Part A
  - \$262,000 per year to provide expanded learning opportunities to two high schools



#### Operating Days & Hours:

- Every school day from dismissal to 6pm
- 30 nine hour intercession days (ex. Summer, Fall Break, Teacher In-service Days)

#### Ratio:

- TK K Grade 10:1
- 1st 8th Grade 20:1

#### **Food Services:**

The MDUSD ELP complies with the federal meal and state nutrition standards comply with California's food and beverage standards provided through the Federal National School Lunch Program.

- Supper right after school
- Snack at dismissal



Partnership with the Food Bank of Solano and Contra Costa Counties for weekly food deliveries and food pantries for students and families.

#### Our Team:

#### Teacher Liaisons

- Site based teachers who collaborate with Site Directors on academic alignment and are the liaison between the school day and expanded learning programs
- Coordinatie staff (teacher and enrichment specialists) who implement clubs and interventions

#### Counselors

- Provide additional counseling services and social emotional support
- Academic Guidance Counselors at the high school level support credit recovery



#### Academics

- Focusing on implementation of a "homework Zone" that provides academic support
- One hour of academic support Monday-Thursday
  - Homework Help/Study Hall/Credit Recovery
  - o Content Standards aligned activities
  - Intervention Support
- Upcoming additions (later slide)

#### Recreation

- 30 minutes of structured play
- Organized sports
- Upcoming additions (later slide)

#### Enrichment

- Visual Performing Arts
- Career Technical Education
- Social Emotional Learning
- Youth Voice and Leadership









- Students spend one hour a week in their site garden
- Hands on garden activities and nutrition education

#### Surveys

- We are in the process of collecting the data from our fall stakeholder survey
  - o Parent / Guardian, Partner Staff, Administrators, and Students
  - This data will help inform program structure moving forward

#### Unduplicated Survey / Registration Process

- All **unduplicated** families will receive a survey in late January / early February regarding interest for 25-26 school year
- Registration will begin in late February / Early March starting with our unduplicated families.
- Space permitting, we will open registration to non-unduplicated families using <u>Priority Enrollment Guidelines</u>

## What is MTSS?

The Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) is a way schools work together to help every student succeed. It's a framework that uses data to identify what students need and to make decisions about how to support them.

MTSS is like a guide for schools to provide the right teaching, extra help, or assessments so each student gets the level of support they need to thrive. It's all about making sure no one falls through the cracks.





#### **UNIVERSAL SUPPORT**

Evidence-based priorities and practices that support the academic, behavioral and social-emotional success of all students in the most inclusive and equitable learning environment



#### **SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT**

Additional services provided for some students who require more academic, behavioral and social-emotional support

**SOME** STUDENTS



#### **INTENSIFIED** SUPPORT

Targeted academic, behavioral and social-emotional support directed toward the few students with greater needs

**FEW** STUDENTS

Universal Design for Learning (UDL), differentiated instruction, integrated education implemented at all levels of support.

- > Social Emotional Support Student Support Resources






### Multi-Tiered, Multi-Domain System of Support

- Apply academic achievement strategies
- Manage emotions and apply interpersonal skills
- Plan for postsecondary options (higher education, military, work force)

### Restorative Practices

Restorative Practices is a system of principles and processes that build and sustain a culture of connection, respect, responsibility and accountability. This is achieved through emphasizing the importance of trusting relationships as central to building community and repairing relationships when harm has occurred.
