At our most recent meetings we discussed:

Annual Giving Campaign letters were mailed in mid-September. We started receiving donations quickly and continue to accept donations throughout the year. Health Insurance Update 2025

With the start of a new year, we need to review and update your health insurance information. The Burnsville Senior Center is a Silver Sneakers, and One Pass site. Your insurance may assist in paying for a class or activity. To determine eligibility please provide the following when registering:

- Your name and address
- Your birthdate
- A copy of your 2025 insurance card
- Your Silver Sneakers, One Pass or Active Renew code

Annual Giving Campaign

The Burnsville Senior Center annual Giving Campaign is ongoing. As of this writing, we've received over \$6,000. Thank you for your generous ongoing support which helps us remain a membership free center that is a welcoming place to all.



Energy Assistance Availability

Minnesota residential utility customers have some protection from utility service shut off all year round. The Cold Weather Rule is a state law that protects residential utility customers from having electric or natural gas service shut off between Oct 1 and April 30. Both homeowners and renters are eligible. Homeowners may be eligible for furnace repairs and winterization services to help reduce heating and electric bills. Renters and those in subsidized housing may also be eligible to get help with their energy bills. If you are having trouble, contact your local utility company and establish a plan to prevent a shut off from happening. Call 651-322-3500 for more information or to get an application.

Donations to the Senior Center

We appreciate your donations of greeting cards, yarn, fabric and used jewelry. Our vintage jewelry sales are huge success and proceeds from them go to the Burnsville Senior Center.

Yarn donations are used by our Knitters and Crocheters who make hats, mittens, scarves, baby booties and lap robes. Likewise, the Quilting group, uses donated fabric to create upwards of 1,200 quilts this year. These groups donate their handcrafted products to local groups and agencies to be distributed among those in need.




