Reports:



- Mr. Lippitt, student ex-officio member, reported on **STAP-Comm**. OPHS came in first place in the Huddle for Hunger. As one of the prizes, 10 cabinet members attended the Monday Night Football game. This spring, several members of the Buffalo Bills will come to the high school to thank and recognize students for their support. Homecoming was a huge success. He thanked teachers, administrators and students. **STAP-Comm** is working on the Roswell adopt a family fundraiser. He thanked the district for valuing student voice on district committees
- Mrs. Hornung reported on several committees. DCIP discussed regionalization and blue ribbon graduation requirements. The Technology Committee reviewed the roll out of the ViewSonic boards installed in all elementary and middle school classrooms and discussed plans for the new district website coming for release in 24-25 school year. The impact of AI in the classroom was discussed. The Inclusion Learning and Support Committee (previous special education leadership council) met and she shared the committee's goal is to combine special education leadership, MTSS and AIS supports to one committee to work to support all students, not just students with IEPs. The Community Engagement and Wellness Committee (Merged Character Ed, Wellness and Nutrition committees) worked on mission and vision.
