

Regionalization

Component of the Blue Ribbon Commission

Regionalization is a collaborative model for creating equitable educational opportunities for all students that leverages the state's existing capabilities, talent, and infrastructure. By engaging in regionalization planning, schools and districts may identify, explore, and pursue a variety of possible solutions to the academic and operational challenges they face by tapping into the full span of resources that already exist in their larger region.

- Not consolidation, but collaboration and partnership amongst school districts
- A response to inequities in access and opportunities and financial realities across the state
- Evaluate our data and our gaps in achievement, access, and opportunity
- Report to NYS this fall
- Regionalization plans for cooperation between districts based on their strengths and needs.
 - Led by each regions BOCES- ERIE 2 with collaboration with Erie 1





What Data is Being Examined and Reported?

- 3-8 data, including sub-group data
- Regents data, including sub group data
- Graduation data, by subgroups data
- Special Education data
- Advanced coursework and CTE offerings and enrollment;
- Building conditions and transportation options;
- Electives, extracurriculars, and other related activities/opportunities for students;
- Family engagement strategies, opportunities, and supports available;
- Local school community partnerships;
- School budgets and aid;
- Student support services available;
- Teaching assignment coverage; and
- Technology needs and resources



Regionalization Timeline

Regionalization plans are designed around 10-year implementation cycles. Initial regionalization planning follows the timeline below (2024-2034).

NOVEMBER 01, 2024	-	Strengths & Needs Tool from Each Component District Due to NYSED
BEGINNING NOVEMBER 01, 2024	-	Regional Convenings Held by District Superintendents
APRIL 01, 2025	-	Interim Progress Reports Due to NYSED
OCTOBER 01, 2025	-	Final Regionalization Plans Due to NYSED
FALL 2026	_	Regionalization Plan Implementation Begins
FALL 2034	-	New Cycle Commences



Rockefeller Institute Study
