

Enhancing Student Leadership Opportunities at the High School Level

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Major Activities

Ensure that all students have access to a **range of extracurricular, co-curricular, or leadership activities** that meet their individual interests and needs, including clubs, sports teams, service organizations, and student government.

Indicators of Success

Complete a **thorough analysis** of existing student leadership opportunities at the high school level by December 1, 2024, and present an **action plan to enhance opportunities** for students on December 17, 2024.

Research on Leadership and Connectedness

“Leadership is not about personality; it’s about behavior—an observable set of skills and abilities.” (Kouzes & Posner, 2023)

In 2003, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and the University of Minnesota synthesized student engagement, school climate, children’s mental health, peer bonding, and student-teacher relationships.

“Various strands of research all point to the same overarching conclusion: Students are more likely to succeed when they feel connected to school.” (USCDC, 2003).

“School connectedness has a powerful influence on students’ academic success, well-being, and long-term outcomes. When students feel valued, supported by teachers and peers, and engaged in school activities, they show higher attendance, academic performance, and better mental health.” (Balfanz, R., et al., 2024)

“**You get out of High School what you put into it!**”

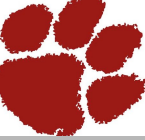

- **Positive Coaching Alliance**

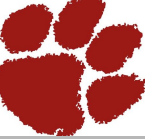
- Workshop attendance each season, chosen by coaches

- Provide opportunities for student voice within the athletic department

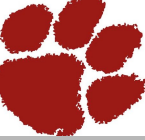




High Schools

 - Guidance meetings

 - 9th grade Mentor meetings
 - Peer Leaders during 9th grade homeroom visits
 - Informal conversations with any adult staff member

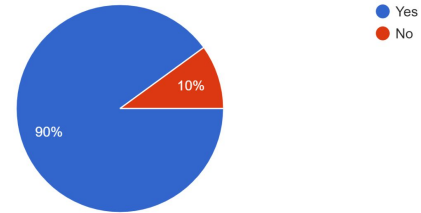

Student Voice Survey: Fall 2024

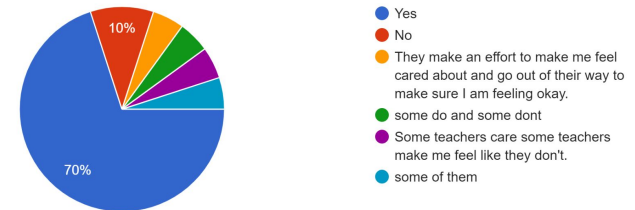
Do you believe the teachers and staff at school make an effort to get to know you and build a relationship with you?

Goal

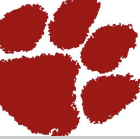
- Increase student participation in extracurricular, co-curricular, or leadership activities by 5%
