### MUSIC

## LIBRARY

We learned about snow and how snow crystals can either be shaped like stars or like plates. We also learned that snow crystals are rarely perfectly symmetrical.



SNOW

We are closely monitoring the plants we are growing on earth (in the library) and comparing how plants grow at the International Space Station! This experiment is being conducted with real astronauts at the Space Station.

#### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

Ist grade has been working hard on basketball skills. Basketball ball skills working on big hand (finger spread), hand on top of the ball with pushing down so the ball came back to waist height. They also were practicing shooting like a "pro" with our cue words of bent knees, pizza platter and cookie jar for a follow through.
