# 2025-2026 FAFSA NOW OPEN





Who should complete the FAFSA® form?
Any student, regardless of income, who wants to be considered for federal, state, and school financial aid programs. This includes grants, scholarships, work-study funds, and loans.



### What do I need?

- Verified account username and password (FSA ID)
- Parent or spouse contributor name, date of birth, Social Security number, and email address
- Income and asset information (if required)

- Must be a senior
- Currently have at least a 3.0 gpa
- Must have moved at least 50 miles during high school
- Scholarship

### Frank Baldachino Essay Scholarship Award

Criteria:

- Applicant must have achieved at least two (2) of the following: (a) minimum of B+ average; (b) ranked in the top 25% of class; (c) ACT score of 24 or an SAT score of 1000 (Math, Reading)
- Applicant must have participated in two sports for two years in each sport
- Applicant must have earned at least one varsity letter in each of two sports
- Applicant must complete scholarship application below (Essay Topic: "How High School Athletics has impacted my Life")
- Applicant must have a letter of recommendation from their high school athletic administrator/director
- School Athletic Administrator/Director must be an NIAAA member and a member of their respective state athletic administrators association
- Due January 25th 2025
