Connection to District Planning and Vision

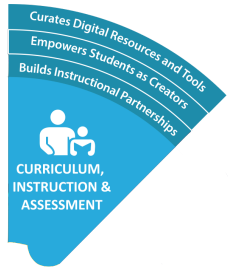
District Vision

Our goal is to provide library space and time, which supports the district vision by providing an environment that stimulates learning, creativity and opportunities.

Objectives

1. Create or maintain a digital system and documentation per year for tracking the use of library spaces in order to evaluate and support learning opportunities with library space
2. Develop a job description with administration for library aides in order to provide an organized structure and explanation for staffing in libraries
3. Monitor use of the summer library programs using attendance and circulation data

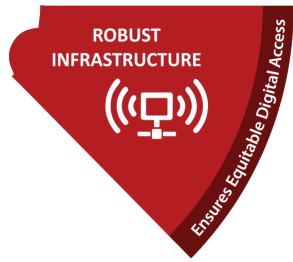
District Vision

Robust Infrastructure

Goal Statement

To continue to work with our technology director to maintain reliable technology resources including devices and online tools.

Data Informing the Goal

The school district has a five-year replacement cycle for devices in place. The district collection policy provides guidance in the acquisition of digital resources.

1. Continue to meet with district administration to make decisions for devices available to students
2. Continue to use the collection policy to acquire up-to-date and equitable resources

Leverages an understanding of school and community needs to identify and invest in print and digital resources to support student learning

Goal Statement

To continue to evaluate the library collections and update resources to support student needs and learning

Data Informing the Goal

In order to evaluate our collection and identify strengths and areas of need, we will continue to utilize the Follett Collection Analysis. This information will guide decisions regarding purchasing and weeding materials.

Connection to District Planning and Vision

District Vision

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Access to high-quality, current resources will support excellence for all students.

Objectives

1. Continue to utilize usage data and DPI guidelines for Common School Funds to guide purchasing decisions
2. Continue to work collaboratively with the district technology director to balance technology purchases with other library needs
3. Continue to keep administration and other stakeholders informed of library funding



Community Partnerships

Cultivates partnerships within the school and local community to promote engagement and a community of readers

Goal Statement

To continue to provide access to materials and meaningful programming through our summer library and after-school programs

Data Informing the Goal

In the absence of a local public library, the school district has supported continuous access to library materials through the summer library program. In addition, students and community members have access to the secondary library after school hours, in order to provide access to the collection and a quiet study environment.

Connection to District Planning and Vision

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Providing access to digital and print resources both after school and in summer provides additional opportunities for students to further their academic success.

Objectives

1. Continue to provide after-school and summer access to school library materials
2. Continue to advocate for the use of our library spaces during summer and after-school programs, while also identifying the boundaries that exist as a part of the school library system
3. Continue to partner with local businesses to provide reading incentives for students



Data & Privacy

Advocates for student privacy and teaches student data and privacy through digital citizenship instruction

Goal Statement

To continue to work with our technology director to ensure that tools and resources used with students are compliant with FERPA and other state and national regulations for protecting student data, in addition to protecting student's right to privacy related to library materials

To continue teaching students the importance of protecting their information and identity in the digital world

Data Informing the Goal

While we do not have specific data defining a need for digital citizenship lessons around privacy and other issues, the culture of our schools and children as a whole demonstrates the need for instruction and discussion of the landscape of the digital world.

In the area of FERPA compliance, we work with the Digital Learning Team in our district to ensure that our teachers are using online tools that are compliant with age and usage restrictions.

Connection to District Planning and Vision

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Considering technology has a direct connection to both the academic and nonacademic communities our students are a part of, our connection to the vision is clear.

Objectives

1. Continue to teach digital citizenship lessons to all students and reinforce main concepts of digital literacy in classrooms
2. Continue to communicate with our Digital Learning Team and reference the district list of compliant digital resources and tools utilized throughout the school are FERPA compliant



Collaborative Leadership

Leads beyond the library: participates in setting the school district's vision and strategic plan for digital learning and fosters a culture of collaboration and innovation to empower teachers and learners

Goal Statement

To continue involvement in both building and district level committees

Data Informing the Goal

While we do not have specific data, the importance of participation and leadership around district initiatives is essential to the role of an active librarian.

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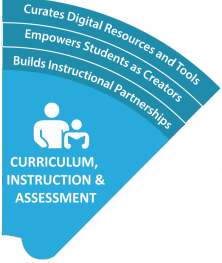
Providing professional development opportunities for staff ensures that instruction at Luxemburg-Casco reflects current best practices in education.

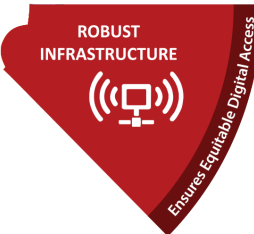
