





School Goals






State Goals



BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

It is every Roadrunner's responsibility to take steps to stop bullying and/or negative behavior. Central Point Elementary staff does not tolerate conduct that undermines a person's right to feel safe, respected, and to learn. Bullving and harassment concerns are addressed with two main goals in mind: 1. To maintain safety and order, and 2. To teach the skill(s) needed to prevent the unwanted behavior from reoccurring. Through the instruction used in our Heart Room, we are able to help those students needing additional social/emotional and behavioral supports beyond the classroom. Staff training in crisis situations through the ALICE program and collaboration with our school resource officer continues to guide our preparation to protect students.


