Citizenship Marks

3rd-8th grades students will receive citizenship marks for each course using this grade scale:

E = Excellent

S = Satisfactory

N = Needs Improvement

U = Unsatisfactory

Standards Grade Scale

Students in 3rd through 8th grades will receive marks for their proficiency toward the grade level standards using the following scale.

4 = Highly Proficient

3 = Proficient

2 = Partially Proficient

1 = Minimally Proficient

NE = No evidence (missing work)

Categories and Weights

Assignments will be entered into the gradebook within one of the following categories which will be weighted for calculation of the overall course grade.

ASSESSMENT = 80%

COURSEWORK = 20%

PRACTICE = 0%

Course Grade Scale

Assignment/assessment scores will be averaged to produce an **overall** course grade for the standard. The course grade will be based upon the following grade scale:

$$A = 90-100\%$$


$$B = 80-89\%$$



PowerSchool Parent Portal




Students in 3rd-8th grades will receive a grade report every quarter. Parents can view student grades and attendance on the PowerSchool Parent portal.

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Missing Work

An assignment is considered as missing work when it is not submitted by the due date.

Missing work will be treated as such:

- The assignment will be marked with the "Missing" special code in the gradebook
- A 49% will be entered as the score for the assignment in the gradebook
- No Evidence (NE) will be entered for the standards attached to the assignment
- o If the work is submitted, it will be marked as late and the assignment score (49%) will be changed to reflect the student's actual score with no deductions or penalties

Late Work

An assignment is considered late work when the assignment is not submitted by the due date that was established, but is submitted by the end of the marking period.


The student will be issued **full credit** for the work submitted (<u>no</u> added penalties or caps on the grade that can be earned). The teacher will mark the student's assignment with the "Late" special code. If the assignment is an assessment, the proficiency level of the standards attached will be entered.

Reassessment

Retake: The student completes another assessment of the same learning targets. The assessment to be retaken may be in the same format or a different format. The higher of the two scores will be entered in the gradebook.

- Students may retake an assessment one time.
- Students must request to retake an assessment.
 - A reassessment request must be made within 10 school days after receiving the assessment score
- Retakes can be in another format.
- For Retakes the original score **is** replaced, if the new score is higher. The new score will <u>not</u> be capped or penalized.
- Teachers may administer reassessments until the marking period is closed.
