Football - 8-1 regular season, with a 2nd place finish in the Downriver League and earning a home playoff game. Reed Picotte, Braylan Orsette, Cam Johnson, Josh Rempert, and Gavin Bolley received All-League honors.

Boys Cross Country - Won the 2023 Warrior Classic, became back to back Downriver League Champions (undefeated 24-0), and qualified as a team for the State Finals for only the 5th time in school history. Caleb Wynn, Brady Boroniec, Matthew Mizzi, Isaiah Clark, and Landon Hoffman were awarded All-League honors.

Girls Cross Country - Finished the season 18-3 and in second place in the Downriver League. They ended up taking 4th place in the Region (best ever finish) and Claire Bireta qualified for the State Finals!

Girls Golf - Finished 4th in the league in 2023. Kira Hunter and Ella Guglielmetti received All-League honors. Team finished tied for 3rd at the Regionals, missing out on team States by a tie-breaker. The girls showed great improvement throughout the season and the young core is looking forward to a bright future.

Boys Soccer - Finished 7-6-4 in the season. The boys improved and played tough throughout the season, ending with a tough loss to New Boston Huron (3-2) in Districts, Cody Sclater and Chris Hernandez received All-League honors. Cody Sclater scored 24 goals and had 7 assists on the year, one of the more productive players in the entire Downriver League.

Girls Swimming - Finished the 2023 regular season 9-2 in the Downriver League and won the end of the year downriver league meet! The 200 Free Style Relay team (Cameron Maldonado, Grace Pauley, Peyton Theisen, and Abby Russell) qualified for the State Finals and Amelia Luecke broke the Allen Park 11 dive school record.

Boys Tennis - Finished 4-4 in the league season. They also placed 4th at the Downriver League match. Trevor Stanley and Logan Jent received All-League honors.

Volleyball - Finished the year in 3rd place in Downriver League. They took 3rd in Gold at their first Belleville tournament, Silver Championship at the 2nd Belleville Tournament, and a 3rd place finish at the 20 team News Herald Tournament. They capped off the season by winning the District Championship and advancing to the Regional Semifinals. Bailey McCalister and Sam Sizemore received All-League honors.
