	Extended COVID-19 Learning Plans: Instructional Delivery Plan Since the Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan was approved, the board must meet to: reconfirm delivery of instruction, solicit public comment on how instruction is going to be delivered, and publicly announce weekly 2-way interaction rates every 30 days. The Board of Education met on Monday, April 12, 2021 and while a motion carried, the Board wished to discuss the mode of instruction in more detail.
