	Departmental Updates: Karen Guobis, Director of Food Services, shared departmental highlights including the recent MDE Audit, increased salad bar offerings, Smart Snack regulations as well as some purchasing new equipment.
	Adam Michalak, Director of Technology provided highlights and initiatives for the 2015-16 school year for the newly restructured Technology Department. The goal is to meet the service demands in a more efficient manner, and is seeing improved efficiencies already this summer. Mr. Michalak shared information about a potential mobile application pilot, new HELP phone line for staff, new Adobe Suite software, new 23" monitors as well as an update on wireless access and security features.
	Rebecca Westrate, Director of Community Services, reported on a new record of students attending Summer Camp, Rapid Tuition Program, full day Latchkey offering on Teacher Professional Development Days, Preschool Program as well as a host of swim programs for the community.

Mrs. Sheldon also provided the Board with an update of the Young 5's Program and shared goals (common assessments) for Professional Learning Communities.
	Dr. Matthew Sokol, Director of Special Education, shared that while only with the District for a short time, he is very impressed with the professionalism and civility of colleagues as well as with technology services. In his first year with APPS, Dr. Sokol will strive to build relationships with staff and parents, learn the culture and ensure Special Education compliance. Dr. Sokol is working on an updated Special Education Handbook and is passionate about instruction and interventions.
