Public Meeting to Institute a Summer Property Tax Levy for Allen Park Public Schools

Dr. Sturock provided a recap of steps and considerations to this process thus far:

- At the July 20 Board meeting, it was briefly mentioned that AP collection of (school) property taxes is twice per year - winter and summer. This does affect cash flow and a reason why the District continues to use the State of Michigan School Loan Revolving Fund. A description of the process and resolutions that would be required to shift all or a portion of the winter tax collection to a summer tax collection was enclosed in the September 14 Board packet for Board members to review.
- This topic was discussed at the September 14 Board meeting and it was determined that on October 12 the Board would bring the 1st resolution providing for publication of notice of the meeting at which a resolution to impose a summer tax levy of all of its annual school property taxes, including debt service, on July 1 of each year will be presented.
- Resolution providing for publication of notice of November 9th public meeting was unanimously approved. As required by law, notification was published in the News Herald on October 28th and also publicized on the home page of the District website.
- Some considerations the District pays approximately \$36,000 in interest through the State of Michigan School Loan Revolving Fund and \$5,000 in fees to facilitate the loan process on an annual basis. The Director of Finance made contact with the City of Allen Park and has been assured that there will be no change/charges in collection of school property taxes.
- The State of Michigan allows qualified senior citizens to have a Deferment of Summer Taxes which allows them to pay the summer taxes without penalty through February 14th. There is a form that would need to be completed and filed with the Treasurer's office every year by September 15.
- The City of Allen Park will accept partial payments from taxpayers. The City Treasurer is willing to make payment arrangements with taxpayers if necessary. Note: A one percent per month penalty is assessed on the (past due) balance.
- Low income residents can go to the Board of Review for a hardship. If they qualify, the taxable value would be reduced.

Discussion ensued, which included Board members expressing the need for due diligence in notifying taxpayers of the change in collection should the resolution be adopted. Emphasis was placed on annual savings, which over time, will generate a substantial savings for the District.

Citizens' questions and comments included:

- Confirmation that there is no increase in taxes.
- Confirmation that school property taxes (Non-homestead and Debt Fund) appearing on the Winter statement will be applied to the Summer statement for a one-time (annual) school property tax.
- Questions specific to abbreviations noted on tax statement, fluctuation of annual school debt rate (refinance of bonds), as well as application of savings were addressed.
- Communication methods.
