	Special Presentations:
	Barton Malow – Kelley Ellis: Bond Work Update
	Kelley Ellis gave a presentation to the board and the community with regard to work that is being completed now and what is upcoming for the new school year.
	APMS stem addition is being worked on and the progress was outlined, work on football field and track will begin next week
	APHS building renovations were completed in July. AC units were lifted on the addition
	 Upcoming projects: We are in bid season to prepare for 2024 work. District re-roofing (BP8), Elementary STEM additions & common toilet room (BP7), and tennis court replacement (BP6) All campuses will be under construction during 2024, the work scope is more extensive than planned.
	 They are changing the order of some of the projects. None of the work is being taken away, it is just being moved around.
	Wayne RESA – Elizabeth Grace: The Future of Early Education in Wayne County Elizabeth Grace and showcased how early childhood education ties in with student success. EC education is a hot topic because it works. There are over 600 GSRP classrooms in Wayne County. This program is at the top nationwide for early childhood education and it meets or exceeds all 10 national benchmarks. Increase in funding: 4-day model \$9,608/per pupil, 5-day model \$11,530/per pupil
	EC Director: Need to connect all EC programs and align curriculum to support the educational outcomes for students for the future.

- EC Specialist This criteria comes from the state Masters or graduate degree in EC or Child Development and 5 or more years of experience in the field.
- Eligibility is determined by age and quintile Everyone should apply because they might not think they will qualify but they do. Qualifications are changing to allow more students to be accepted.
- With the size of our district they said we could fill 7-8 classrooms for GSRP.
- Ratio is 1:8 so for a classroom of 16 students you would have a lead teacher and an assistant teacher. With 18 students you need a third person but they do not have a credential requirement.
- For long-term success they feel we should bring in the Director now even if not starting til January or next fall

Elizabeth Grace along with Dr. Daveda Colbert and Dr. Sophia Lafayette-Lause, all from Wayne RESA, responded to all of the board member's questions.
