



Verona Area Natatorium and Aquatic Center Mission Statement

To provide the entire Verona Area School District community with a wide range of equitable, safe, educational, and fun aquatic activities and programs.

A Community Facility for Residents and Non-Residents, owned and operated by the Verona Area School District.

General Information

Verona Area Aquatic Center includes two pools. The 8-lane competition pool has an attached 12-foot 6-inch deep diving well with seating for up to 800 spectators. The warm water pool is an 8-lane, 25-yard pool, with a ramp and stairs that go into 3ft of water. The deepest area in the pool is 5 ft. The warm water pool also has an adjoining Multi-Purpose room. The Aquatic Center provides the community with a wide range of aquatic activities and programs including swim instruction, open swim, adult lap swim, scuba, senior water exercise, birthday parties, and more!

The Natatorium is a 6-lane, 25-meter pool, located on the grounds of Badger Ridge Middle School and Core Knowledge Charter School. The Natatorium offers the community a wide range of aquatic activities and programs including swim teams, adult lap swim, master swim practices, and more!

Resident/Non Resident

A resident is someone who resides within the Verona Area School District boundaries. A Non-Resident is anyone who resides outside the Verona Area School District.

Program Cancellations

All classes must meet their minimum number of students. VASD Aquatic Facilities reserve the right to cancel, combine, or make schedule revisions as necessary.

Weather Cancellations (School Days)

When the Verona Area School District closes or delays due to weather, VASD Aquatics Facilities will be closed or delayed also.

Weather Cancellations (Non-School Days)

If the weekend weather is questionable, please check our website (verona.k12.wi.us/pool) as cancellation information will be provided. Cancellation information will be provided via email, website, and social media. Make sure to have or create an account on RecDesk to receive all of our communications.

Pool Rentals

Our rental rates are charged to cover lifeguard, custodial services, and facility use costs. More details about this information may be found on our website. The pool will not be rented for fundraising or profit-making ventures. Pool rules must be followed. Adult supervision is required for all groups of children. Please make reservations at least two weeks in advance.

Aquatic Programs

Registration for some of the Aquatic programs must be done through our program portal at veronanat.recdesk.com. You MUST have an account to register.

Family Swim (Warm Water Pool)

Family Swim is designed as a time for families to swim together. All children under the age of 8 must have a person 15 years of age or older in the water within arm's reach at all times. A lap lane will be provided during Family Swim unless the pool is crowded. *Swim Diapers: Swim diapers (cloth or disposable) are required (by State Law) for all non-toilet-trained individuals.

Family Adapted Swim Time (Warm Water Pool)

Verona Aquatic Center offers open swimming for families with children with special needs. Family Adapted Swim Time (F.A.S.T.) is designed for families with children with special needs to use the facility for therapy, to enjoy being with friends/family, or to just relax. The swim will be set up like an open swim but with the understanding that there might be people making loud noises, some lights may be turned down, or special adaptive devices may be used to help people swim in the water. Anyone is welcome to join this swim time.

Open Swim (Warm Water Pool)

Everyone is welcome to attend the open swim. Children, 8 years of age and older may attend Open Swim without an adult. Children under the age of 8 must have a responsible person (15 or older) in the water with them at all times.

Coast Guard-approved floatation devices are allowed during Open Swim. A lap lane will be provided during open swim unless the pool is crowded. See the Pool Schedule for open swim times.

Lap Swim (Competition Pool and Natatorium)

Master Swim Program (Both Morning and Evening classes)



Community Swim Class Information

Lessons are filled on a "first-come, first-serve" basis. All classes have limited space available, so register early. Please note that registrations will not be accepted over the phone.

REFUND POLICY

VASD Aquatics has a No-Refund policy. However, full refunds will be given if the VASD Aquatics department cancels a class. A prorated refund may be given only if severe illness or injury prevents participation. In the case of an eligible situation for a refund, a household credit will be applied. Individuals will not be eligible for a refund if they register their children or themselves for more than one session at a time and have placed their student in an incorrect class or if they choose to cancel out and/or withdraw from a class.

** You may register each child for ONE swim class (Parent/Tot-Level 6) at a time ** Individuals who register their children for more than one session at a time will not be eligible for a refund if they have placed their student in an incorrect class.

MISSED LESSONS

Occasionally, students may need to miss a lesson. There are no make-up classes available for missed lessons.

Age Requirements: Your child must be 6-18 months of age to participate in Parent-Tot 1, and 18 months to 3 years of age to participate in Parent-Tot 2. To participate in preschool 1, 2 & 3, your child must be 4 to 5 years of age. To participate in Level 1 – Level 6, your child must be 6 years of age and older. No exceptions will be made.




Tours of Verona Area High School


