

Peak to Peak now recognizes Speech and Debate as the National Forensics League (NFL) Honor Society!

Speech and Debate has a particularly rich and long competition season: we compete in CHSAA (Colorado High School Activities Association) tournaments, including 4A State; the NSDA (National Speech & Debate Association) District Qualifiers and Nationals; NIETOC (National Individual Events Tournament of Champions) and TOC tournaments; and national tournaments such as the Cal Invitational at UC Berkeley. Within NSDA, Peak to Peak is a member of the Rocky Mountain North District.

It can be a lot to mentally organize, but the main points of the season are CHSAA's Novice (Sept.-Oct.) and Varsity (Nov.-Feb.) seasons and NSDA's qualifying season, which runs concurrent with CHSAA but ends in March with our District National Qualifying Tournament, where students compete to represent our district at the NSDA National Tournament in June, 2025. Many tournaments will be both CHSAA and NSDA or NIETOC competitions.

Students earn NSDA points for competing. A minimum of 25 NSDA points are required to be eligible to compete at the District Qualifying Tournament in March. Additionally, NSDA points count toward a student's induction into NSDA's Honor Society.

Most tournaments run all day on Saturdays; during the Varsity season, this will include three preliminary rounds, with semifinals and finals rounds after. Making it out of the preliminary rounds is called "breaking." Student receive ballots for each round, with feedback from their judge(s) and a "Reason for Decision" (RFD) to explain how the judge arrived at their decision.

Faculty Spotlight

Kurt and Bert through the Ages

Since 2013, high school science teacher Kurt Schaefer and creative and visual arts teacher Heather Bertarelli have been traveling the world together with their students, from New York to Italy and beyond!

Your journey at Peak to Peak has spanned many years. Can you share how long you've been part of this community and the courses you've taught during your time here?

Kurt: I'm now in my 21st year at Peak to Peak, which is so hard to believe! I've taught every flavor of chemistry, including the Kitchen Chemistry elective I started several years ago for upperclassmen who are interested in the intersection of science and food.



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Heather: I'm in year 18 and have taught a plethora of amazing visual arts courses- from digital art and photography to AP Art History and AP Studio Art. I've been the Yearbook advisor, coached middle school volleyball, and helped run Student Council. I truly love being involved in our incredible community and I am thankful for the opportunities to teach diverse visual and creative arts courses.

Reflecting on your early days at Peak to Peak, how have you seen the school and its students evolve over time? What stands out most about the growth and renewal of the community?

Kurt: I feel that our efforts to provide experiential learning opportunities within the academic year via our Peak Week courses has shown our students that learning can extend far beyond classroom walls.

Heather: I completely agree with Kurt (and usually do!) Peak Week is such an exciting development, because it allows all students to experience incredible learning opportunities on our campus and beyond! Mr. Schaefer and I are both really looking forward to spending Peak Week in New York City on an arts focused trip in March 2025- we will see two Broadway shows and explore art museums and galleries!



You've guided students on many enriching adventures. What's the secret to a successful student trip?

Heather: Mr. Schaefer and I have traveled together with students since 2013! We have traveled to Italy and New York City with students the most. We always do our best to plan a meaningful and super-active itinerary for these trips. We have found that walking and exploring tons during the day leads to calmer evenings.

What are some of the most memorable experiences from your student trips?

Kurt and Heather: There are so many! Marveling at Botticelli's Birth of Venus and DaVinci's Annunciation with students in a near-empty Uffizi Gallery in Florence, riding bikes along the ancient Appian Way outside of Rome with students (while almost getting run down by a herd of sheep crossing our path), taking students to their first Broadway show in New York, the list goes on!

Having dedicated 18 and 21 years to this community, what has inspired you to stay, and what do you think makes Peak to Peak a place of continual renewal and excellence?

Kurt: For me, it's undoubtedly the students. I love how, without fail, Peak to Peak students are willing to hop on my "Genius Train" each August without knowing me or where the journey will take them. Their trust in me and in my colleagues, as well as their genuine curiosity, are the reason I've stayed teaching as long as I have.



What message would you like to leave for our alumni?

Heather: Embrace your creativity always and if you're feeling down, seek opportunities to help and serve others. Oh and art can be your answer! Also, thank you to all of the students who have chosen to travel with Mr. Schaefer and I, we cherish the memories with all of you!

Boys Soccer


