Rachel Carson Healthy Planet Award!

Congratulations to Senior Caroline Miller, who is the recipient of the 2024 Rachel Carson Healthy Planet Award!

Environmental icon and author Rachel Carson graduated from Chatham University in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1929 with a major in Biology and a minor in English. Among the many books she wrote on the environment, she is best

remembered for Silent Spring, published in 1962, which gave an accurate account of what might happen if the pesticide DDT was used unchecked. This book was directly responsible for the banning of that pesticide and gave impetus to the founding of the environmental movement. For her work, Carson was selected by Time Magazine as one of the 100 most influential people of the last century, and Silent Spring was chosen as one of the ten non-fiction books "that changed minds and lives."

Chatham University created the Rachel Carson Healthy Planet Award to honor their famous alumni and her legacy. The award is given each year to one deserving student from every high school around the country who shares Carson's commitment and passion to improving the environment and their community through sustainability.

Caroline received a special edition of Silent Spring, in addition to a \$2500 merit scholarship and preferred consideration for the full-tuition Rachel Carson Scholarship if accepted and chosen to attend Chatham University.



FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTION DAYS

The Trinity Area School District has been approved to utilize Flexible Instruction Days (FIDs). Trinity will *move to remote instruction when schools are closed due to weather or other concerns It is no longer a *necessity to cancel instruction for weather or facility issues. When a FID is announced teachers will teach from home and students will learn remotely from home. If it becomes necessary to cancel school, staff parents, guardians, and students will receive notification via the Skylert System, local television, and radio sources. On FIDs the students will log onto* their Chromebooks and attend school remotely as they have done during closures in the past. Staff, parents/guardians, and students need to be prepared for short-term or sporadic closures due to weather related issues. Students should have their Chromebooks available daily at school and at home. Staff and students must be prepared to work from home at all times.
