Dear Blair Community Schools Families,

As we approach this holiday season, I want to take a moment to reflect on our shared accomplishments and express my gratitude for your continued support of Blair Community Schools. Together, we have made tremendous strides in providing an exceptional education for our students.

I am thrilled to share that Blair Community Schools has been rated Excellent for the third consecutive year by the Nebraska Department of Education! This recognition reflects the hard work and dedication of our students, staff, and families. Additionally, Deerfield Elementary and Otte Middle School achieved Excellent ratings, while Arbor Park and Blair High School earned Great ratings. These accomplishments highlight our collective commitment to excellence.

For those unfamiliar with Nebraska's AQuESTT system, schools and districts are evaluated using a comprehensive approach that considers academic achievement, student progress, graduation rates, and attendance. This system provides a wellrounded picture of educational success and opportunities for continuous improvement.

Our academic outcomes also demonstrate significant progress:

- College-Going Rate: Our rate has climbed from 70% in 2020 to 81% in 2023-24, which is nine points higher than the state average.
- State Assessment Proficiency:
 - Science: 91% of our students are proficient, compared to 74% statewide.
 - Math: 76% of our students are proficient, compared to 58% statewide.
 - Reading: 73% of our students are proficient, compared to 59% statewide.

Since 2017-18, our students' proficiency rates have shown remarkable growth:

- Reading: From 57% to 74%.
- Math: From 56% to 76%.
- Science: From 72% to 91%.

These achievements underscore the outstanding commitment of our entire school community to excellence in education. As we celebrate these milestones, I want to thank each of you for your role in making Blair Community Schools a place where students thrive. Your partnership is invaluable, and we look forward to continuing to work together to achieve even greater success in the coming year.

On behalf of everyone at Blair Community Schools, I wish you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year filled with peace and joy.

To ensure that you receive future communications, please take a moment to follow the steps below. In some cases, emails from the school may be mistakenly filtered into your junk or spam folder.



If this email was sent to your junk or spam folder please follow these instructions:

- 1. Locate the Email: Open your junk or spam folder and look for an email from the school or School Messenger. 2. Mark as Not Junk: Right-click the email and select "Mark as Not Junk" or "Move to Inbox."
- 3.Add the Sender to Your Contacts: Add the school's email address to your contacts to prevent future emails from being filtered.

We highly recommend taking these steps, as this will help ensure that you don't miss any important communication from the school, including reminders about school events, deadlines, and other updates that may affect your family.


UNIFIED BOWLING TEAM
