### Keeping Kids Safe!

Keeping students and staff safe is the District's top priority. Our goal is to provide safe and secure learning environments where high quality educational experiences help cultivate a culture of life-long learning for all. In order to provide quality learning environments, students and staff must be safe. That

is why the District has safety systems in place, so learning is the focus. This year the District is providing a series of safety videos. Access the QR code to view the District's first video on Crisis Alerts and Crisis Response specific to the Core Four.







#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

Clear all snow and ice from your car before driving. Be sure to get everything off, not just the windows. Snow left on the roof of a car can slide onto your windshield, or blow onto another.



#### DRIVING IS VISUAL

Make sure your wiper blades, heater, and defroster are in good working conditions during winter weather. Driving is a visual task, so always be sure your windows and mirrors are clean and clear and your visibility is good.



Winter days mean darker mornings and

afternoons. Be aware of students

walking, crossing the roads and riding

Remember to turn on your headlights for better visibility and to be seen.

#### **ALLOW MORE TIME**

Be prepared for winter driving and allow time to safely travel to your location. Drivers who allow extra travel time, help ensure appropriate speed for weather conditions and a safe following distance for wet and icy roads.

#### SLOW DOWN

bikes to and from school.

**BE AWARE** 

Slow down when driving on ice and snow. It's easier to skid or lose control traveling at higher speeds. slowing down, remember downshifting as an option. Also, give yourself time to safely come to a stop.



#### KNOW THE BUS ROUTES

Be aware of alternate bus stops. During the winter the Transportation Department utilizes alternate bus routes. Students will appear at different locations other than where drivers are used to seeing them.



#### WATCH FOR STUDENTS

Be alert to students crossing roads, walking on sidewalks, or riding bikes. Icy conditions could mean they fall.

#### **REMAIN ALERT**

Students are more likely to be rushing during cold temperatures and could be hidden by poor visibility or snow banks. Remain alert for children who may be hidden or standing in or near the street at the bus stop due to snow piles.

#### **BE PATIENT**

School bus drivers are well trained on driving in inclement weather. However, snow and icy roads can slow down even experienced drivers. Safety is each driver's priority and extra time may be needed to get from stop to stop.
