The fourth Sunday of Advent in Year C, God promises a ruler from Bethlehem, whose origins are ancient. He will shepherd Israel, bring peace, and his greatness will reach the ends of the earth.

Reflections From Our Pastor

Dec. 22nd, 2024

My Dear St. Agnes Family,

Blessings! DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Jul 23 - International flight from Tampa to Rome. Dinner & entertainment on board.

Jul 24 – ROME / CASTEL GANDOLFO / TODI - Welcome to Rome! Meet with our representative & transfer to the medieval hamlet of Castel Gandolfo, one of the most charming villages in Italy, famous for the beauty of nature that surrounds it, and the 16th century summer Papal Palace, Walking visit and leisure time to enjoy a real "cappuccino with a view". Continue enjoying breathtaking views of the Umbrian countryside, to the picturesque village of Todi, our home for the next two nights. Check-in & welcome dinner.

Jul 25 – ORVIETO (Eucharistic Miracle) - Half-Board at hotel (B & D). Morning visit to Orvieto, the incredible town that sits atop a big rock of volcanic formation. The city is dominated by the cathedral dedicated to the Assumption of Mary and the 14th -century Reliquary of the Santo Corporal, the liturgical cloth onto which appeared the blood of Christ from a consecrated host. Mass celebration and leisure time to discover the charm of the bohemian old town. A visit to Orvieto will reward you with a delightful, perfectly preserved, and virtually traffic-free world! Return to Todi for Overnight.

Jul 26 – TODI / SIENA / ASSISI - Following breakfast enjoy a scenic ride to the Tuscan city of Siena, birthplace of Saint Catherine and one of the best-preserved medieval towns in Italy. This wonderful city, a UNESCO World Heritage site, is rich in works of art & traditions, famous monuments and a fascinating pedestrian historical center! Mass celebration in San Domenico and visit the Sanctuary of St. Catherine; which includes the former home of the family and the birthplace of the saint. A walking tour of the city old district will reveal the most iconic landmarks: Mangia Tower, the Cathedral, the Public Palace and Piazza del Campo, one of Italy's finest squares. Afternoon arrival to Assisi, check-in at hotel, dinner and overnight.

Jul 27 – ASSISI, Half-Board at hotel (B & D). Our morning starts with Mass celebration in St. Mary of the Angels Basilica, a massive structure build to protect the Porziuncula, the chapel where St. Francis founded the Franciscan order. Following Mass you will have the opportunity to visit the Capella del Transito, the place of St. Francis death; the beautiful Rosetto, and the Capella delle Rose, where he often retired to pray. The second part of our guided visit will take us to the medieval town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site where in the early 13th -century, St. Francis began his ministry. We will visit St. Francis Basilica (tomb of the saint), and then walk our way through these picturesque streets to the Santuario Della Spogliazione, where Blessed Carlo Acutis' tomb is placed. (Carlo is the first millennial to be declared Blessed). From there, we'll continue to St. Francis' birthplace & to the Church that honors St. Clare, the foundress of the Poor Clare Sisters. Afternoon at leisure. Overnight.

Jul 28 – ASSISI / LANCIANO (Eucharistic Miracle)/SAN GIOVANI ROTONDO - After breakfast, leave for San Giovani Rotondo, the small town located in the Apulia Region, and made famous by the incredible life of one of Italy's most beloved modern-day saints: San Padre Pio. On the way to San Giovani, we'll stop in the small village of Lanciano, for private Mass in St. Longinus church; the site of the Eucharistic Miracle that occurred in the 8th - century. Check-in at hotel in San Giovani, dinner and overnight.

Jul 29 – SAN GIOVANI ROTONDO - Half Board at hotel (B & D) - After breakfast we start our journey celebrating Mass at the Tomb of St. Padre Pio. The rest of the morning will be dedicated to visit the sites associated with the life of the humble Capuchin Priest. Take the free afternoon for spiritual recollection; or join us on an optional tour to nearby Monte Sant'Angelo, to visit the white town perched over the Adriatic sea, and the late 5th - century St. Michael the Archangel Shrine. After dinner, in San Giovani attend the weekly candlelight procession to St. Padre Pio Sanctuary. Overnight.

Jul 30 – SAN GIOVANI ROTONDO / POMPEII - Following breakfast, departure to Pompeii, the famous ancient city buried by the ashes of Mt. Vesuvius in 79 AD. Visit La Madonna del Rosario Shrine and Mass celebration in one of Italy's most important Marian sites. Tradition says that two very important relics belonging to the Passion of Christ are here in custody: a thorn from the Crown of Thorns and a small piece of the Holy Cross. Hotel check-in and leisure time to discover the city on your own. Dinner and overnight Pompeii.

Jul 31 – SORRENTO - Half Board at hotel (B & D). This morning we drive to Sorrento, a lively seaside resort town since Roman times, now famous for stunning views of villas dotting the rocky cliffs along the coastline. Walking tour of this picturesque resort and free time for you to enjoy Sorrento's layback spirit, admiring among other things, the spectacular Gulf of Naples Bay and the Island of Capri.
