ENERGY SAVINGS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

The Washingtonville Central School District has been installing solar panels on the roofs of the high school and middle school as well as on the hill behind the high school. The WCSD Energy Savings Project will significantly enhance energy efficiency, lower operational costs, and modernize crucial infrastructure. The suite of Energy Conservation Measures (ECMs) include a solar photovoltaic (PV) system, energy-efficient roof replacements, LED lighting retrofits, upgraded unit ventilators, and high-efficiency transformers.
