

In her short time here, Ms. Prucnal has already made her mark, fostering meaningful connections with students, faculty, and families alike. Her nearly 25 years of experience in independent Catholic schools, including her most recent role as Assistant Head of School for Academics at Merion Mercy Academy, has given her the tools to launch new initiatives and engage our community in Villa's mission. Ms. Prucnal's thoughtful and collaborative leadership is already inspiring positive change as she builds on our strong traditions while steering Villa into the future.

Ms. Prucnal's path to Villa was paved by her dedication to women's education and her passion for developing the whole person. Reflecting on Villa's mission, which centers on empowering young women to discover their purpose, Ms. Prucnal shares,

“I believe that educators have the opportunity and responsibility to guide students as they grow to their fullest potential. I'm dedicated to inspiring, empowering, and unlocking opportunities for students so they may lead the change the world needs.”

Ms. Prucnal's journey into education began with her unique blend of academic interests in history, chemistry, and education, which has profoundly shaped her approach to leadership. She holds a B.A. in History and a B.S. in Chemistry from Saint Xavier University, along with an M.A. in Teaching and Learning from DePaul University and an M.A. in Education Administration from Saint Xavier University. This diverse academic background allows her to bridge the analytical and contextual aspects of decision-making, helping her connect with both students and faculty with different teaching styles. “In chemistry, there's a solution at the end of the day, but history is more about understanding context. Bringing both together gives me a broader perspective as a leader,” she said.

Her shift from teaching to administration came early in her career, driven by a desire to contribute beyond the classroom. “I moved around a bit and taught at different schools, which gave me greater awareness of how different institutions operate,” Ms. Prucnal explained. “I've always said yes to opportunities, and that's opened doors for me. I've realized that leadership is about empowering others to do their best work.”

Her passion for women's education is deeply personal. “I attended an all-girls Catholic high school outside of Chicago, and though it's no longer open, I recognize now just how formative that experience was for me. I'm committed to providing our students with the same transformative opportunities—building their confidence, giving them leadership experiences, and fostering a strong sense of community.” This commitment aligns perfectly with the mission of Villa Joseph Marie, which was founded by the Sisters of St. Casimir to empower young women spiritually, academically, and personally.

Ms. Prucnal was particularly impressed with the students at Villa, who played a significant role in her decision to join the community. “The students were so impressive during my visits. Their poise, confidence, and engagement were unlike anything I've seen. I want to ensure that every student who walks through our doors continues to receive that kind of life-changing education,” she shared. At Villa, the advantage of a single-sex environment is clear—every leadership position, from sports teams to clubs, is held by a young woman, creating an unparalleled space for students to grow into confident, capable leaders.

As Ms. Prucnal steps into her new role, she looks forward to working alongside Villa's President, Jeanne Frawley, and the Board of Trustees to continue guiding the school toward future success. “Valerie's clear passion for women's education, her collaborative approach to leadership, and her curiosity in exploring best practices make her a fantastic fit for Villa,” said Ms. Frawley. Together, they will lead the school into its next chapter, focused on continuing Villa's tradition of academic excellence while preparing for the school's centennial celebration.



Ms. Prucnal is looking forward to the upcoming PAIS accreditation process and strategic planning initiative, which will help guide Villa Joseph Marie into its next steps as the school approaches its 100-year anniversary. These efforts will serve as a roadmap for Villa’s future, positioning the school for continued growth and success.

Ms. Prucnal also expressed excitement about Villa’s growing emphasis on STEM education through the Project Lead the Way program, a significant differentiator for the school. “STEM is one important path for our students, but Villa provides something for everyone—whether you’re interested in the arts, leadership, or sciences, there’s a place for you here.”

Case Study Program

MISSION AND MONEY: WHERE THE MAGIC HAPPENS

Villa students are receiving a master class in servant leadership thanks to Philadelphia area business leaders willing to share their expertise.

Local leaders opened their doors and their hearts to discuss the ethical challenges facing today's C-Suite. Following prep with NBC 10's Tracy Davidson, student teams visited Corinne O'Connell at Habitat, Kevin Mahoney at UPenn, Dr. Denise Torres '94 at Geisinger, Jim Morrissey at James D. Morrissey Inc. and Tina D'Orazio at Philadelphia Eagles.

Students heard first-hand accounts of what it means to make decisions that impact employees, patients, colleagues, constituent partners, and the community. They learned what it means to consider environmental, geopolitical, and industry-based factors when choosing a path forward and then presented recommendations to

a panel of judges.

Case Studies are common in university settings, but Villa Joseph Marie's case study competition was the first of its kind at the high school level. This premier experience in Bucks County is open to regional schools and judged by university and industry leaders, exploring how faith can inform board room decisions.

The concept was inspired by the global leadership of the Sisters of St. Casimir, and it provided an opportunity to showcase the power of a strong moral compass when making key leadership decisions, "Our Sisters are showcased as an example of what intentional, responsible, long-term planning looks like, and those skills are crucial for our students' future success," stated VJM President, Jeanne M. Frawley '94.

for Catholic Education, the program was coordinated by Villa alumna Christine Zecca Caltabiano '98. Through her efforts, Villa showcased several teams and welcomed students from area high schools onto campus for two competitions this past year.

Our students joined teams from Conwell Egan, Father Judge, Holy Ghost Prep, and Malvern Prep. Each group investigated a business problem, examined potential solutions, and proposed the most effective path forward. Fielding questions from a panel of experts, participants used supporting evidence to justify their recommendations. Judges included leaders from Flynn & O'Hara, Knights of Columbus, La Salle University, Neumann University, Penn Community Bank, Penn State University, St. Joseph's University, Villanova University, and more.

Winning teams earned scholarship dollars from area colleges, with over \$560,000 available. Malvern Prep and Villa Joseph Marie took home the top prizes in fall and spring, respectively.

This is one of the many ways Villa Joseph Marie serves as a leader in experiential learning, preparing students to be future leaders and compassionate members of society. Huge thanks to the alumnae, community members, and university partners for their support of our students and the region.

National Social Studies Honor Society

During the 2023-2024 school year, Villa welcomed a ninth honor society, RHO Kappa, the National Social Studies Honor Society. Led by history teacher Anne Crotty, RHO Kappa aims to encourage academic success in social studies inside and outside of the classroom. For Villa, this meant student mentorship, community activities, and welcoming speakers to talk with students. To join the society, students must have participated in the National History Day competition, have a B average overall, and have or plan to take five history courses at

the school. The highlights of the society's activities this year include upperclassmen mentoring underclassmen while completing their National History Day projects, placing wreaths on veterans' graves at the Washington Crossing National Cemetery, and a visit from representative Brian Fitzpatrick along with local judges. Through these activities, students have strengthened their knowledge of local government, politics, and community. The addition of RHO Kappa has been a great success for Villa and the girls.

Art National Honor Society

Villa welcomes its newest honor society, the National Art Honor Society, this fall. Founded in 1978, the National Art Honor Society aims to celebrate high school students and their work while connecting them with opportunities for awards and scholarships. investment challenge **REAL WORLD LEARNING**

This April, five students from the Class of 2024 competed in the fifth-annual Haub School of Business High School Investment Challenge at St. Joseph's University. Lauren Braun, Reed Fritz, Erica Johnson, Emily Steuer, and Madeleine Todd worked under faculty advisor and teacher James Bender to learn and navigate the “whys” of the stock market. The competition challenged the girls to invest a one-million-dollar budget with a stock simulation system, which enabled them to practice financial strategies through live trading over three months. Together, the girls

created and kept track of their plans, investments, and strategies to present to a panel of esteemed judges at the university on the day of the competition. Villa's team was named a runner-up against other private schools from the area that competed.

The Challenge gives our students an experiential learning opportunity and real-world experience to be leaders in front of an authentic audience.

mock trial

NOURISHING THE FUTURE WHILE DEVELOPING TOMORROW'S LEADERS

Mock trials provide an engaging way for students to learn about the legal system and related careers while developing persuasive argumentation, public speaking, teamwork, and self-confidence. They also learn to manage the tone, pacing, and structure of their speeches. The Pennsylvania Mock Trial Competition, which began in 1984, offers an abbreviated trial experience, including opening statements, testimony, evidence presentation, closing arguments, and jury deliberations. With 250 to 300 teams competing each year, it is one of the largest state competitions in the country.

Congratulations to Villa's 2023-2024 Mock Trial Team, who were well-prepared for the court simulations. The featured "whodunit" murder case for the 2024 competition was Commonwealth of Pennsylvania vs. Addison Booker. Under the guidance of VJM Social Studies teacher and Mock Trial Advisor Mr. Joseph Wilson, along with Mock Trial Attorney Coach Judge Brian Marriott, Esq., both the prosecution and defense teams thrived.

A mock trial team consists of three attorneys and three witnesses on both sides of the case. The jury scores each part of the trial based on categories like direct examination flow and cross-examination effectiveness. The invaluable support of PA Deputy Attorney General Catherine "Catie" Pirolli, Esq. '08 and Bucks County Assistant District Attorney Alexandria "Alex" Baland '08 has helped shape the JV and Varsity teams into confident advocates.

Students dressed formally for mock trials; attorneys wore dark or neutral business attire while witnesses dressed in character. Co-captains Erica M. Johnson '24 and Abigail Gillespie '24, who have participated for

all four years, kept "order in the court" with skill and enthusiasm. "It was an excellent year," Erica shared,

"The girls were really enthusiastic about the case and this season in general. I really enjoyed my years of Mock Trial that have taught me so much about writing, public speaking, and critical thinking. Moreover, it has brought me closer together with my Villa sisters."

On January 18, the prosecution team faced Tamanend Middle School at the Bucks County Justice Center in Doylestown, winning unanimously. Gloria Winkler '25 was awarded Best Witness, and Meredith A. Czyz '25 received Best Advocate.

On January 30, our varsity defense team secured a victory against Holy Ghost Prep. Though the jury ruled against us on February 7, Gianna Simpson '25 delivered an exceptional opening defense, and seniors Sheridan "Reed" Fritz and Abigail Phillips were praised for their performances. Judge Brian T. McGuffin commended the team for their confidence and poise. Emily Steuer '24 and Nadia Kozij '25 were recognized for outstanding performances as Best Witness and Best Advocate respectively.

Rylind C. Pasquito '25, who has been participating in Mock Trial since her freshman year, shared, "I am comfortable with public speaking and interested in law and the courtroom, so this is a good opportunity to practice my public speaking."

Mr. Wilson added, "It's a unique club. The students do all the work; they're so hardworking and driven. I just give tips and support! The ball is in their court."

Board of Trustees Launches Strategic Planning Process

This past May, the Villa Joseph Marie Board of Trustees unanimously voted to embark on an exciting, year-long strategic planning process. The goal is to plan a foundation for the future, ensuring that Villa continues to thrive in its mission of empowering young women through faith, education, and service. While the plan will focus heavily on the upcoming three years, it will serve as the foundation for charting the course toward our centennial — leading us to Villa’s 100th anniversary in 2032.

Why Strategic Planning?

Plans translate values into action. Strategic planning plays a crucial role in ensuring that Villa’s practices reflect its deeply held values as it continues to grow and succeed. It allows us to set clear, focused goals, guiding the school toward future opportunities with confidence and purpose. The process also strengthens Villa’s identity, making the organization more resilient and adaptable. In addition, a well-developed plan enhances our ability to fundraise effectively, ensuring that our resources are aligned with Villa’s long-term vision.

Leading the Way

Two dedicated board members stepped forward to co-chair the Strategic Planning Steering Committee. Dr. Karen Elinich ’84 and Matt Kaness P’23 are joined by a diverse group of stakeholders – faculty, staff, alumnae, and parents – all of whom are committed to shaping the future of our school.

Areas of Focus

Five working groups were formed to explore key areas of focus by considering these questions, which will be answered with our faith and mission at the forefront:

- How will our curriculum and college prep empower students of the future?
- How does Villa best serve our community – internally and externally?
- How will opportunities beyond the classroom – artistically, athletically, experientially – enhance student preparation?
- How will Villa’s financial model help us thrive for the next hundred years?
- Why Villa?


On September 30, 2024, members of the Villa community — including administrators, staff, and faculty — volunteered their time to hand-deliver surprise packages to 24 students accepted into Villa's Early Acceptance Program. Applicants who scored high on the 7th Grade Practice Test were invited to apply for this prestigious program.

This year's Early Acceptance number marks a significant increase from just 10 EA students in 2023. Volunteers covered three counties to personally deliver the good news, creating heartfelt moments for both recipients and Villa representatives.



In July, twenty-five students took part in Edge Camp, the two-week preparatory program for students interested in applying to Catholic high schools. The course focused on HSPT preparation, English and Math, resume writing, and interview skills. Strategies and skills learned benefit students on entrance exams and all future standardized tests.

In August, our Jems in the Class of 2028 came together before the start of the school year to take part in fun, reflective community service as a part of the F.I.R.S.T. Camp. This also provided these students with a fun way to meet their new Villa sisters and become more familiar with Villa.



Villa Joseph Marie has been named to the AP School Honor Roll, celebrating the success and growth of the school's AP program! This recognition reflects Villa's commitment to increasing college readiness, offering opportunities for students to earn college credit, and fostering a strong college-going culture. At Villa, 67% of seniors took at least one AP Exam during high school, 58% scored a three or higher, and 14% took five or more exams!



On Saturday, June 1, 2024, Villa celebrated the graduation of 97 members of the class of 2024. Recognized through a variety of awards, including full tuition scholarships, Catholic High School recognition awards, and scholarships for excellence in athletics, community service, music and art portfolios, this year's graduating class received over \$30 million in college scholarships and grants. We are so proud of the Class of 2024 for their accomplishments and extend our heartfelt thanks to the Counseling Department for their guidance and support in helping students reach this significant milestone. We look forward to their future successes!



As they look ahead to the 2025 season, the team is committed to continuing their progress and representing Villa with pride and passion.
