- The amount of funding we receive for Early Childhood Family Education and School Readiness, as well as other school programs, is determined by the total number of children from birth to age 5 in the district.
- The School Census counts help the district to project future enrollment and to plan more effectively for the community educational needs.
- The School Census is used only for school business.

SCHOOL READINESS

SCHOOL READINESS PRESCHOOL CLASSES

The school readiness preschool program is a 4 Star Parent Aware rated program for children ages 3-5 and all income levels. The teachers are licensed in education and early childhood.





Parent Aware Star Rating

Star Ratings help you identify programs using research-based practices that prepare children for school and life.

Research-based High Scope curriculum, implemented in classes, teaches children to initiate, discover, experience, and learn about ideas, events, and people. Children will create, experiment, problem-solve, and resolve conflicts as they learn. This approach enhances each young person's growth in the foundations of academics as well as in social-emotional, physical, and creative areas. The development of each child is discussed with parents/guardians utilizing the Child Observation Record (COR) on-going assessment. The program includes a diverse grouping of children reflective of our community and inclusive with early childhood special education. Classes run September to May and follow the school calendar.




