Dear West Valley Community,



Emergency Evacuation Recap

On Monday, December 16, as students and staff were arriving at school, we evacuated the building due to a possible gas leak. We then decided to evacuate students to one of our off-site locations. Finally, we made the decision to dismiss students and transport them back home based on the uncertainty of being able to re-enter the building.

Students, staff, and our families did an outstanding job implementing our emergency plans. We are working internally to reflect, evaluate, and assess our practices and update as needed. With that said I would like to share some important reminders to families when these types of situations occur:

- Communication to families from the school regarding emergency situations and/or evacuations will occur when it is safe to do so and when enough accurate information is gathered to provide to parents.
- Although students with access to a cell phone can message parents at any time during an emergency, it is critical to wait for information from the school or law enforcement.
- Parents should never show up at an emergency site disclosed by a student without direction from the school or law enforcement to do so.
- Parents, community members, news media, etc. are not permitted to be present inside of the reunification site without expressed permission from the site coordinator or law enforcement.
- Students will not be released to families or dismissed until we have concluded our processes, accounted for all students and staff, deemed it is safe, and/or have received a directive from law enforcement, if applicable.

The safety of our students and staff is of the utmost importance and we continue to review our practices with respect to emergency situations to provide the best care possible in these situations. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns regarding our emergency procedures.



BOARD CORNER

HOW THE BOARD AGENDA IS DEVELOPED

Board meetings are the place where the board conducts its business in public. Even though an agenda is not required for school board meetings, it is good business practice to use one. The use of an agenda will help the board stay focused, and ensure that meetings are productive, orderly, and don't drag on indefinitely without purpose. Board members, employees of the school district, and residents of the school district may suggest agenda items by contacting the superintendent, who in turn will communicate the suggestion to the president of the board. To ensure there will not be any surprises on the agenda it is helpful for the president, vice president and superintendent to set time aside on the Wednesday before the meeting to discuss potential agenda items. The board president should also seek input from and communicate with all other board members so that everyone understands the purpose of the agenda items brought before them. The district clerk ensures that board members and administrators have the agenda to view by 5 p.m. on Thursday. This gives them ample time for any additions, changes, or deletions to the agenda before it is sent out to the public on Friday. The board meetings are typically held the third Tuesday of each month and there are times that the agenda is amended at the meeting. Item(s) could be brought to the board's attention on the day of the meeting that would be beneficial for the district to act on at the current meeting rather than to wait for the next. It is not a practice that is encouraged on a regular basis but sometimes it is unavoidable.

The board typically uses a consent agenda format instead of the traditional agenda. Benefits of using a consent agenda for routine items within the agenda help move the meeting forward and keep the participants engaged. Items will be grouped within the designated sections of the agenda that are similar in nature and will be voted on as one. Generally, consent agenda items are considered self-explanatory and non-controversial. Board Docs is the program the district uses to store board meeting information. This program is easier to maneuver for researching historical information, more user friendly, and provides a quicker turnaround time for the district clerk to prepare documents.

26TH ANNUAL FINANCIAL AID NIGHT

The **26th Annual Financial Aid Night** will take place on Wednesday, January 8, 2025, from 6:00-7:00 p.m. A representative from St. Bonaventure University's Financial Aid Office will provide information for 11th and 12th graders and their parents/guardians on the financial aid process, including completion of the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), grants, scholarships, and various student and parent loans.

Financial aid is money that comes in many forms. It generally consists

of a combination of grants (actual cash that you do not have to pay back), scholarships (actual cash awarded for academic achievement), and loans (must be paid back). These types of aid come from a variety of sources: the college itself, individual states, private donors, and the federal government (by far the largest source of aid). Once you've filled out the FAFSA by scanning the QR code, colleges will extend to you the types of aid for which you are eligible.



DR. STEPHEN KOURY LEADS HANDS-ON RESEARCH PROJECT AT WEST VALLEY

On Thursday, December 19, Dr. Stephen Koury from the University at Buffalo worked with West Valley students on a hands-on research project. As part of their ongoing study, students amplified DNA and ran it through a reaction. They then uploaded the data to a program that identified bacteria from a sample collected at Scoby Dam.

This project was the second step in a larger research initiative, with the students planning to present their findings at a symposium at the end of the school year. This unique opportunity allowed students to dive deep into scientific research, gaining valuable experience in the process.
