Kindergarten Korner




Students in kindergarten have had a very busy month with an election, turkey feather spelling and a Balloons Over Broadway project!

1st grade classes have had a lot of fun in November! They have earned a donut day for making great choices, made foil balloons for Balloons Over Broadway and made butter!












Poetry in 5th Grade

Creativity Shown in Mrs. Kane's Art Classes




These burrowing animals were given cozy homes by second graders during art class.

Students worked with chalk to create their own Aurora Borealis on paper and also had a chance to work with watercolor!











Mr. Tuttle's 5th Grade Science Class


